

Community, Arts, Sports, Childcare

- Mayo County Childcare Committee processed Child Enrolment Data, Change in Circumstances submissions and delivered Fee Payment Policy actions for services across the County. In addition, Critical Incident training was provided to 18 services in the county.
- Mayo has been allocated €217.742 for the Local Enhancement Programme launched in early Nov. The applications will open late Dec/early Jan.
