SEA ANGLING

Brief notes on fishing grounds :

As may be seen from the list of boatmen, large numbers are engaged in fishing the waters herabouts, mainly the inner waters of Killala and Lacken Bays since there are no properly equipped trawlers. For angling, the most interesting fish to be found here are Bream, Pelleck and Glassen and perhaps an occasional salmon. Kilcummin Head and around that part of the shore is good for Pelleck and Bream and young Glassen are fairly plentiful. The pier at Rathlacken and that side of the shore is good for Pelleck and sometimes Glassen. Fishing is good here from April to November. Bream weighing up to 5 and 6 lbs. have been caught here and the average weight would be about 2lbs. In the case of Pelleck these weights would be 20lbs and 4½ lbs respectively and Glassen, average about 2lbs. Skate are very numerous in Lacken Bay and at Kilcummin.

Kinds of fish to be caught:

Skate, Bream, Pelleck and Glassen, the latter not so plentiful as the others. Occasional Salmon.

The rod used by local fishermen is a strong sapling or pole, about eighteen feet long. ~~With~~ A sand eel is very effective bait for Pelleck and Glassen and the lug worm for Glassen & Bream.

The areas were well stocked with pheasant about six years ago and during the past year or so they seem to be returning in large numbers. For Pheasant shooting, the best localities are Missadrene, Gleenslaghan and Carn (preserve); Carrickanass is also fairly good. Missadrene bogs are the best centre for grebe which are also found at Barnhill and Carreweeilleen. Woodcock are sometimes quite plentiful at Barnhill and Carrickanass. The marshes at Killageary provide excellent sport for wild duck, the decoy being very helpful here.

Mr James Massey's lands at Carn are preserved, otherwise the landowners very seldom refuse permission to shoot over their property.
