

VILLAGE OF MANULLA POPULATION 120.

DESCRIPTION: Situated just north of the main Balla/Castlereagh road. Is 3 miles N.W. of Balla; 5 1/2 E.S.E. of Castlereagh; 4 1/2 S.S.W. of Ballyvaughan and 2 1/2 N.N.E. of Bellema. A village which is strung out in detached dwellings along a 600 yd. stretch of by-road - containing about 30 households in all. The dwellings are mostly single storey thatched cottages - there is a two-storey slated shop, a similar size dwelling house, and a few single-storey slated houses. There are, along the road, at least half-a-dozen unseemly ruins of cottages. The school house fronts the main road at the southern end of the village. Beside it is the P.O. also a shop - single-storey slated - the main portion of the village lies some few hundred yards further north.

Town Hall - None. Parks & gardens - None.

No public water supply nor sewage system. Village wells.

Nearest station - Manulla. Distance 1/4 M. Bus. Every day except Sunday. Westport/Loughford route.

No public lighting. No dance hall. No cinema or theatres.

No library. No churches. R.C. services at Bellema (2 1/2 M); Church of Ireland at Bellema.

Post office heads school. M.O.; Postal orders, stamps.

No banks. No sports or photographic supplies.

No swimming pool nor baths. No social clubs. No industries.

No public monuments. No public buildings.

No hospital. No fairs nor markets. No half-day.

No garages nor petrol stations nor conveyances for hire.

No boats, bicycles, caravans nor houses.

No local improvements committee.
