Environmental Awareness:

- National Food Waste Recycling Week took place the first week of June.
- Working with the businesses in Achill Island on a project to encourage reusable cups.

Climate Action:

- A Climate Action Plan implementation workshop was held in May with the Mayo County Council leadership team. Work is currently progressing on 60% of actions.
- The Pathfinder project for energy reduction on 4 MCC buildings has gone to tender.
- The evaluation process for the Community Climate Action fund has been completed by Mayo County Council and is now with the Department of Environment, Climate and Communications for approval.
- ISO 50001 Energy Management training and corresponding actions are progressing with mock evaluation to be held in October.
- All Mayo County Council Energy Use data has been submitted to SEAI ahead of the July Monitoring and Reporting deadline.

Waste Permitting and Enforcement:

- The Enforcement team continue to participate in the Multi-Agency Checkpoints with additional joint inspections taking place at mutual premises of interest.
- 11 project applications were submitted under the Anti-Dumping Initiative, with 9 approved for funding (€104,859).
- Enforcement officers carried out surveillance and inspection across problematic areas in the lead up to Bonfire night.
- 2 new Certificate of Registration applications, 3 new Waste Facility Permit applications and 1 review Waste Facility Permit application has been received.
- Members of the team will take part in a site visit with other Local Authorities to see the new National End-of-Waste Criteria for Recycled Aggregates in action.

SDG Update:

Mayo County Councils work plays an important role in delivering on all 17 SDGs. In our year as SDG Champion, we aim to raise awareness of the goals, provide training and clearly identify and promote how our work aligns to the SDGs. See www.gov.ie for info. Yeterinary:
