Clonmoccus was the name of several land league meetings subsequent to the historicrishdown gathering of 1879.

Henry Parnell addressed a large concourse of people in Clonmoccus in 1880 and an address of welcome from the ladies league of the district was presented to him.

In 1891 Parnell who had spent the night in the Commercial Hotel (not known) addressed a crowd from the hotel window. Parnell was not well received. He spoke to a large gathering at Krishdown on the same day.

HISTORIC HOUSES. BURIAL PLACES.

Mr. W. Emely - American minister to Eng. Anecdotes said to have come from Clonmoccus one district around the town. Specific information unobtainable. The only probable link being a pair of stained glass aisle windows in Clonmoccus R.C. Church, bearing the inscription which says that the windows are to the memory of Very Rev. Peter Reynolds P.P. and are the gift of Mr. W. Emely, Hop. Kinton, Mass., U.S.A. The date is 1875.

Most Rev. Dr. Dalton, Bishop of Meath, born in 1833 in Church St., Clonmoccus, in the house now owned by Mrs. John Murphy, merchant. In the register of Births 1871 for Clonmoccus national school is the entry that John

Dalton entered the school on May 4th of that year. His father's occupation is listed as publican. John Dalton was then 8 years old and was placed in 4th class - so must have had schooling before enrolling.

Later he studied at Utrecht and was ordained in Rome. Was Professor & President of Maynooth College - wrote "Horae and His Age and Others and consecrated Bishop of Meath in June 1942.

Canon Mick Bourke P.P.: President of St. Joseph's College, Years before being made P.P. to Kilcolman in 1818 one of the best Irish scholars of his day. Wrote "The Oxyean origin of the Gaelic Race and language" - "Irish Grammars" and "Easy lessons in Irish."

He is buried in Beanycarroll a few miles north of Clannorris.

Chief Justice Maguire, President of the High Court - born at Headwood, long but reared in Clannorris from the age of 3 in the house now occupied by Dr. Jno. Maguire, a broker. Justice Maguire's father, Dr. Jno. Maguire, obtained the medical fellowship of the district and removed from Long in 1891. Studied at Clongowes and N.U.I. became a solicitor - Barrister - Attorney General, and represented the university as T.D.
