I am delighted to introduce the Annual Report for 2020.

This Report outlines some of the work of the Council in delivering public services and infrastructural projects during the year in Ballina Municipal District. In April, the Councillors agreed the Schedule of Works for the District. This provided for a total expenditure of over €9 million on such services as housing maintenance, roads, parks and open spaces, street cleaning and Burial Grounds.

A significant contribution also continues to be made to the social and cultural life at local level, through our General Municipal Allocation.

Even though our public counters were closed for some of the year, we continued to provide our services and supports during the Covid-19 Level 5 restrictions in 2020.

We tried to deliver as many of our services over the phone or online as possible. In circumstances where members of the public needed to meet a council official or a particular service in person, this was arranged by appointment.

All of us also had to adapt to new ways of working and this was achieved through a combination of remote working and rota systems ensuring the health and safety of Staff and Customers alike.

Similarly, you, as Councillors also had to adapt to new ways of carrying out your business, socially distanced meetings and online Teams meetings became the new normal.

The year was also marked by sadness following the death of Ms. Joan Finnerty, who worked in Ballina as Traveller Accommodation Liaison Worker. Joan was a loyal and dedicated colleague and is missed greatly in the office. Ar dheis Dé go raibh a hanam.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge and thank all the Council staff for their hard work and dedication, and to extend my best wishes to everyone who retired in 2020.

I look forward to continuing to work with you to meet the needs of the citizens of Ballina Municipal District.

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## Housing Stock

As of 31st December 2020, there were 477 units of housing stock within the District.

## Tenancies

A total of 24 no. permanent Tenancies were allocated in 2020. Of these 24 tenancies, 18 were new tenancies, 1 transfer tenancy, 2 succession tenancies, 2 Long Term Leasing tenancies and 1 tenancy under the Repair & Leasing Scheme.

## Refugee Resettlement

In keeping with Government Policy and the targets set for County Mayo, 1 family was accommodated in Ballina in 2020.

## Homelessness - Ballina Municipal District

Within BMD there are 4 no. units available within our stock to accommodate clients in need of emergency accommodation on a longer-term basis. The units are fitted with white goods and bedding. 50 homeless presentations including 23 new presentations were dealt with within BMD in 2020.

## Housing Loans

During 2020, Ballina Municipal District processed 7 No. Rebuilding Ireland Home Loan applications. Of those 7 No. applications, 6 no. were approved. This represented a monetary value of €849,410.

There were 13 applications/enquiries in relation to the 2016 Incremental Tenant Purchase Scheme. 2 of these applications were progressed in 2020.

## Roadworks programme

### Drainage Works

Funding of almost €227,000 was invested throughout the District specifically dedicated to addressing drainage issues to ensure public safety and to protect our roads infrastructure. 19 schemes were completed at both urban and rural locations.

### Surface Dressing

The 2020 surface dressing programme investment amounted to €564,570 ensuring improved infrastructure in our rural communities.

### R314 realignment.

Phase 1 of the R314 Realignment Project south of Killala was constructed at a cost of approximately €1.2million. The works included the following:

1. Installation of 7 new Public Lighting Columns
2. Construction of approximately 800m of concrete kerbing and associated landscaping works
3. Upgrade of the existing storm water drainage including additional gulleys
4. Reconstruction of the existing road pavement as well as vertical and horizontal realignment

### Community Involvement Schemes

Community Involvement schemes included Phase I of Lugnagran. Road widening was completed which involved community and local industry cooperation for Mayo County Council to advance the works.

Urban works were also completed at Primrose Hill, Ballina with Phase 1 of road widening completed. Works were completed under Ministerial Consent due to the Archaeological significance of this location adjacent to the Dolmen of the Four Maols.

### Ballina Town Centre’s first Town Centre Health Check.

The findings of a major new consumer survey on the strengths and opportunities for Ballina Town Centre were released in 2020 by the Ballina Collaborative Town Centre Health Check Team (CTCHC). Funded by the Heritage Council, in collaboration with Mayo County Council, the consumer survey reveals people’s impressions and perceptions of Ballina’s shopping and eating options, along with leisure and entertainment facilities.

### Ballinglen Museum of Contemporary Art, Ballycastle – official opening

The Ballinglen Museum of Contemporary Art, officially opened in July 2020. A state-of-the-art two-story gallery, it showcases artwork from the Ballinglen Permanent Collection – a growing contemporary-art collection that is already one of the largest in the country.

### Motor Tax Office in Ballina.

The Motor Tax office in Ballina collected €1.35M and conducted 8,360 transactions in 2020.

## Water Services

Mayo County Council, Water Services Section has continued to operate water and wastewater services during 2020 for the North Region [ Ballina & Swinford areas] under the existing Service Level Agreement with Irish Water. All WTPs, WWTPs and associated networks have been maintained to a high standard ensuring the delivery of high quality water compliant with relevant Drinking Water Regulations and compliant waste water discharges. These works have continued uninterrupted during Covid 19, Level 5 restrictions with some difficulties mainly due to the dedication of water services staff and adapting to new ways of working to comply with Public Health requirements.

Some infrastructural improvements have been carried out in 2020 by Irish Water in conjunction with Mayo County Council, Water Services:

1. Ballina RWS water from Lough Conn has been delivered to Ballycastle Town and Environs. This work has been planned for some time but was expedited following a cryptosporidium incident on the old Ballycastle supply in 2018.
2. A new Waste Water Treatment Plant [WWTP] has been commissioned for Killala Town. This new plant adjacent to the old Asahi Plant will be operated by the contractor [Glan Agua] for a two-year period before reverting to IW/MCC. Treated effluent from the new plant is being discharged to Killala Bay through the old outfall from the Asahi Plant, which has been rehabilitated during 2020. This plant has been constructed to eliminate the discharge of untreated wastewater to Killala Bay, compliance with EU Directive on Urban Waste Water Treatment and provision for phased growth for Killala.
3. In conjunction with 2 above Watermain Rehabilitation has been carried out within the Killala Network. This work has eliminated all old cast iron pipework and lead connections within the town, which will improve water quality for Killala residents into the future.
4. MCC Water Services, Find and Fix team has carried out extensive Water Conservation works in Ballina Town and Environs in 2020. These works have affected a major reduction in Unaccounted for Water [UFW] resulting in a saving of approx. 2000m<sup>3</sup>/day and these works are ongoing.

## Ballina Flood Relief Scheme

In February 2020, Mayo County Council in partnership with the OPW appointed RPS Consulting Engineers Ltd to further assess the CFRAM Study, identify options and prepare a detailed scheme for Ballina which is economically viable, socially acceptable and environmentally sustainable. The entire scheme will be implemented in five different stages. Stage I, which commenced in March 2020, is currently ongoing.

## Free Wifi for Ballina and Crossmolina

Ballina and Crossmolina were selected to host a new free Wifi service which covers the main streets.



### **Ballina – Irelands greenest town.**

Ballina Municipal District adopted a strategy in July 2020 aiming to become Ireland's greenest town by 2025. This strategy brings together families, business and community groups in Ballina and North Mayo to work together on ambitious, transformative projects to bring about a brighter, more sustainable future.



### **Ballina Fringe Festival**

Maser, one of Ireland's leading street artists, created his street art piece during Ballina Fringe Festival 2020, on Hill St. Ballina. Maser was inspired to create this piece by the Mayo phrase 'it's not just a place to visit, but a place where you feel alive',

The artwork is the fourth piece created for Ballina Fringe Festival's 'PureBallina' community street art project, which aims to give community groups the opportunity to engage with and participate in the development of high-quality artworks.

### **Ballina Adventure Hub**

Funding was announced in 2020 for the Ballina Adventure Hubs. This initiative aims to increase participation in physical activity and adventure sports in Ballina, encourage and maximise the use of the natural facilities locally such as Belleek Forest and the River Moy, develop sustainable local leadership for sport, and work with stakeholders to improve access and remove barriers to entry for adventure sports.

### **Outdoor dining.**

The MD also liaised with café, restaurant, hotel and bar owners serving food and a number of Section 254 Licenses were issued allowing them to put tables and chairs on the footpath/public realm space outside their premises. District.

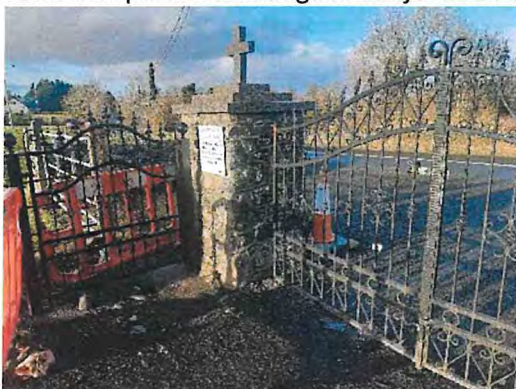

#### **Ballina Harbour**

The high unsightly wall between the Quay Road and Ballina Harbour area has been removed. A new 1m high double sided limestone wall has been erected set back 2m from old wall. These works have opened up the River Moy to public view and have created a safer access onto the public road from the harbour area by providing adequate sight distance at the junction point.

Improvements and Upgrades have also been carried out on the Aids to Navigation on the 8km approach channel along the River Moy from Killala Bay to Ballina Harbour.



#### **Killala Harbour**

A new enclosed concreted compound has been constructed for the winter parking /storage /repair of leisure craft and fishing vessels. This will prevent the parking of vessels on the public harbour area for the winter months, resulting in the safer movement of traffic within the harbour area. This enclosed area can be used for parking vehicles, trailers etc during the summer months .

# CASTLEBAR MUNICIPAL DISTRICT

Castlebar Municipal District governs the town of Castlebar and the general Castlebar area. It has a population of 30,000 and 28 Electoral Divisions.

There are 7 elected Members in Castlebar Municipal District since the Local Elections in June 2019 and they meet on the last Wednesday of every month to discuss the development and implementation of policies across a broad range of areas. The members work closely with the Director of Services, the Head of the Municipal District, the Senior Executive Engineer and the support staff of Mayo County Council to ensure that the Castlebar area continues to thrive, both socially and economically.

The town of Castlebar is actively twinned with Höchststadt in Germany, Auray in France, and in the USA, Dixon, Illinois, Westchester, New York State and Peekshill, also in New York State. These are seen as important cultural links.

## 2020 HIGHLIGHTS

- › **Belcarra Pride of Place:** Congratulations to Belcarra for achieving first prize in the National Pride of Place Awards in 2020.

Served by many hardworking Voluntary Groups, Belcarra has won many Community awards at local, National and Regional level. Belcarra boasts fantastic amenities such as Belcarra Heritage Centre, a beautiful riverside walk, Carra Caravan and Camping as well as numerous archaeological sites.

The Manulla river runs through Belcarra. Two village enhancement areas adjacent to the river with a 3km 'Riverside Loop Walk' with two pedestrian bridges, have been developed by the community in co-operation with local farmers.



- › **20th anniversary of the twinning of Castlebar and Höchststadt in Germany:** In July 2020, Castlebar Municipal District held an online celebration with Friends in Höchststadt of the 20th anniversary of the twinning of Castlebar and Höchststadt in Germany. - > **Moore Hall:** Mayo County Council acquired 80 acres of the Moore Hall Estate in early 2018 and the objective was and is to develop it as a nationally important tourism attraction and Nature Reserve under a strategic partnership with the National Parks and Wildlife Service. A masterplan has been drafted for the estate and this, when approved, will act as the roadmap for future development.

Development works include the restoration of the Walled Garden, which had fallen into disrepair, as well as new visitor facilities including walkways, seating, play areas and signage.

Funding of €350,000 was approved under the Rural Development (LEADER) and Cross Border Co-operation Programmes.

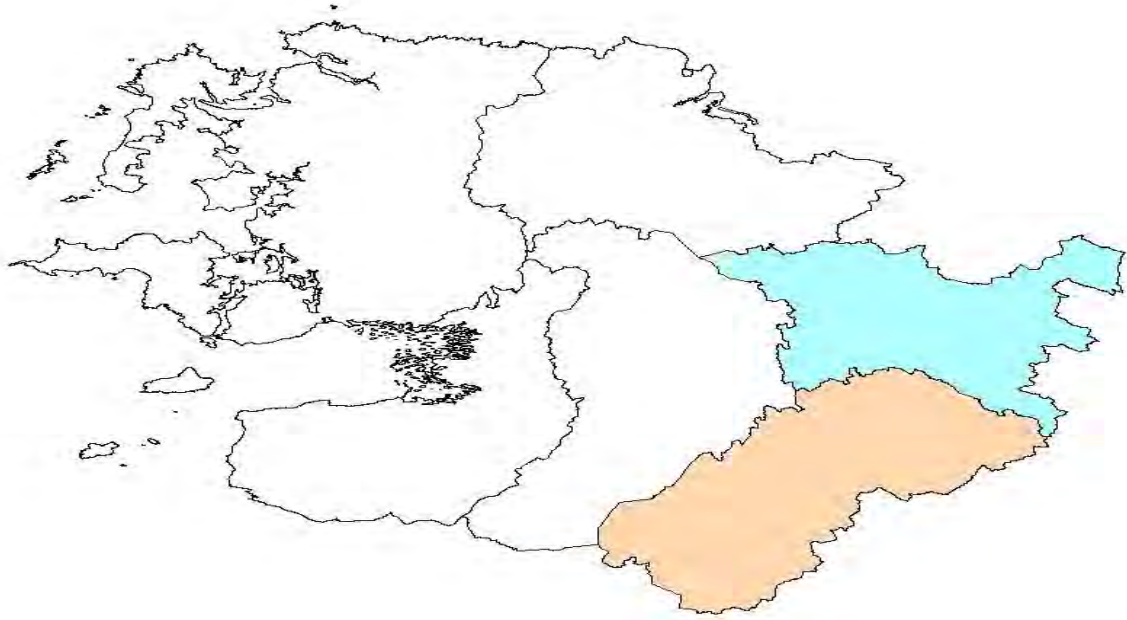

## CLAREMORRIS - SWINFORD MUNICIPAL DISTRICT



The Report of the Local Electoral Area Boundary Committee 2018 made a number of recommendations in relation to County Mayo and in particular the revision of existing boundaries between Electoral Areas and the size of these areas. As a result, the Claremorris-Swinford Municipal District was established, and is substantially larger than any other Municipal District in the County. The Municipal District now serves:

- one third of the population
- one third of the County's elected representatives
- almost two fifths of the total road network
- seven of the twelve towns in the county with population greater than 1,000

The Municipal District consists of Claremorris Electoral Area, with 6 Elected Representatives, and Swinford Electoral Area, with 4 Representatives. This is a total of 10 Elected Representatives for the Municipal District as a whole. From May 2019, an additional population of 11,958 was included with the former Claremorris Municipal District, in the new Claremorris-Swinford Municipal District Area. This consists of the Towns/Areas of Kiltimagh, Swinford, Foxford, Mayo Abbey and their hinterlands.

### Covid 19 Pandemic

The year 2020 has been dominated by the Global Covid-19 pandemic Mayo County Council have had to respond and adapt to how quality services are delivered in a Covid 19 Environment.

The pandemic has drastically changed the way business is conducted resulting in socially distanced and online Municipal District Meetings, staff rotas and remote working arrangements.

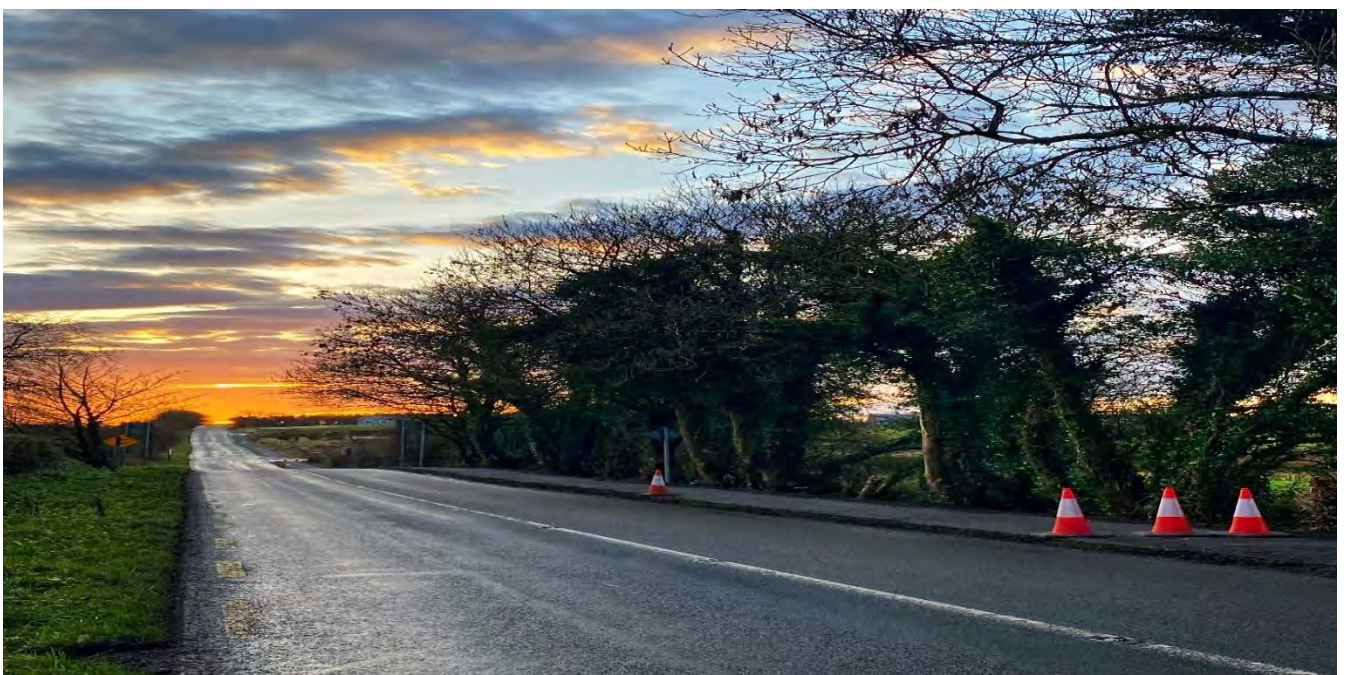

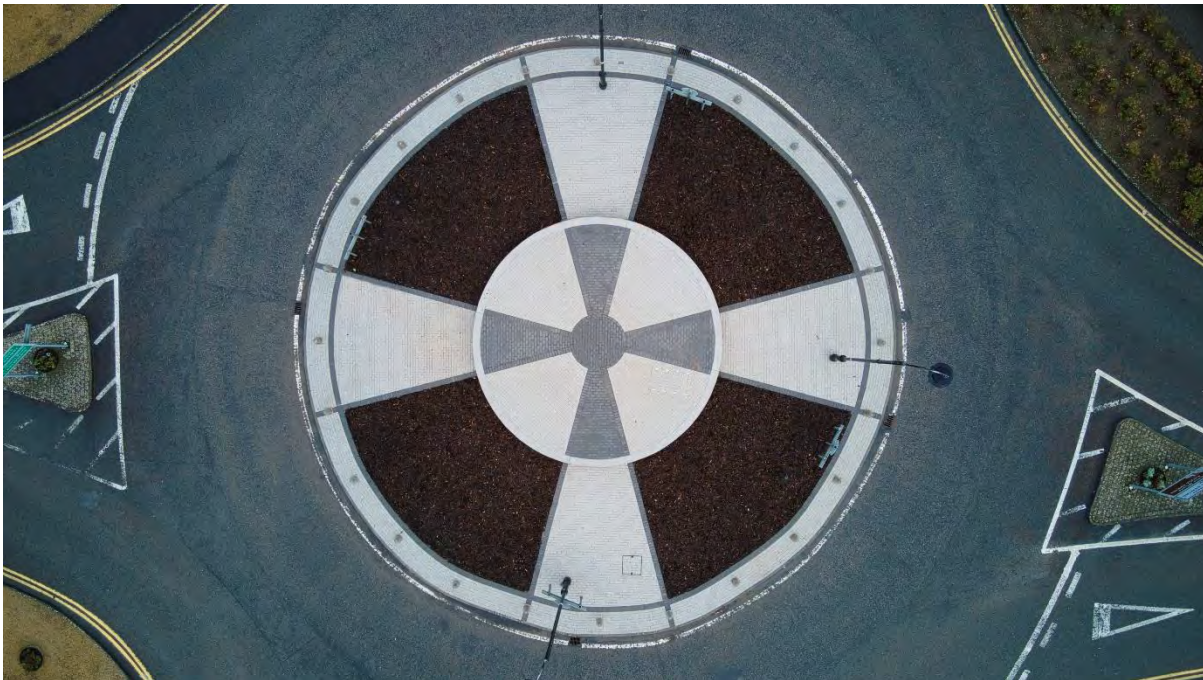

### Roundabout, Knock

The roundabout at Knock is the gateway to the village for most visitors but was in a sadly dishevelled state up to 2020 when it was re-designed and upgraded using Town & Village 2019 funding. The new design takes inspiration from a Maltese Cross and provides a central podium for potential future artwork to be located. As well as works to the roundabout itself, two new pedestrian crossings were provided and the Council also carried out works to make the entire area wheelchair accessible and age friendly.



### Charlestown Playground and Roundabouts

Under Town & Village funding awarded in 2018 and completed in 2020, the playground area of Charlestown has been upgraded to provide designated parking, a safe segregated area for children to congregate, and stone benches for parents keeping watch over their children at play. The scheme also solved the problem of flooding in the area by a re-grading of levels and new underground pipework. Under the same funding scheme, the two roundabouts on the N17 as you approach the town from the south were re-designed using a simple design with river pebbles and circular planting.



### **Barnacarroll Car Park**

This scheme, funded by Clár and completed in 2020, involved the creation of a new formal car park to serve the community of Barnacarroll. The car park is centrally located and extensively used by Barnacarroll primary school, Barnacarroll pre-school, and Barnacarroll Community Centre.



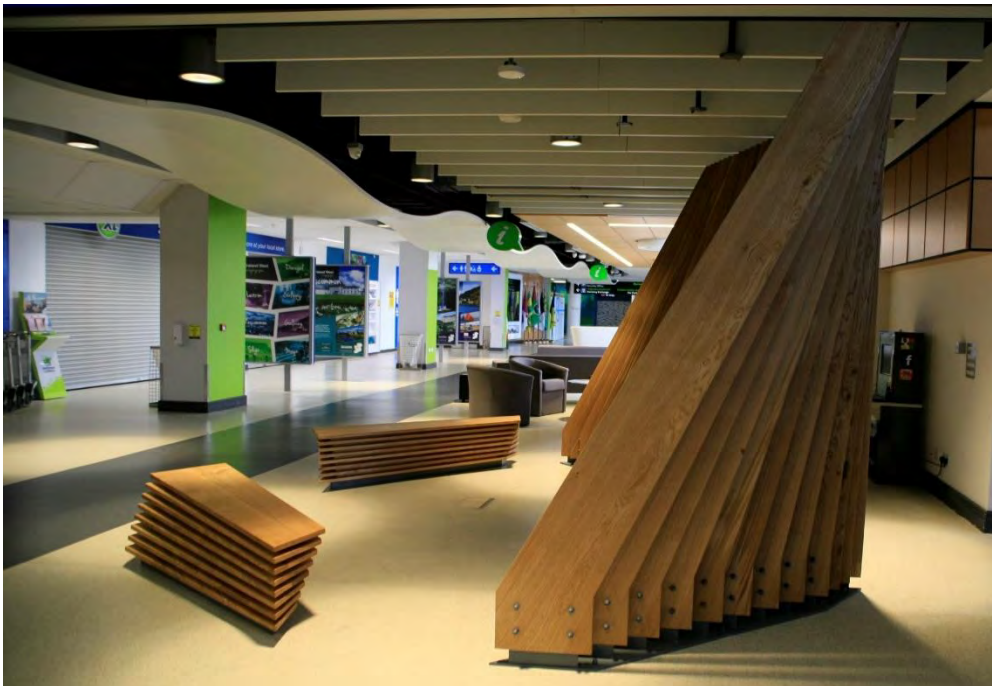
### **Ballinrobe Library Grounds**

This was a very sensitive project on a protected site in the heart of Ballinrobe town. The grounds around the former Church of Ireland, now library, have become a green oasis in the busy town centre and a beautiful pedestrian route has been created thanks to sensitive landscaping and planting that does not detract from the historical site.



### IWAK Pavilion

This new pavilion, designed by Cox Power Architects and constructed by Kenaidan in 2020 under Town & Village 2018 funding, completes the design of the Visitor Discovery Centre in Arrivals Hall of Ireland West Airport Knock. The abstract concept creates a space in a busy corner of the airport that may be used for performance, display, or simply to wait to greet loved ones.

# WESTPORT-BELMULLET MUNICIPAL DISTRICT

The Westport Belmullet Municipal District stretches from Leenane to Belmullet / Blacksod and is approximately 100 miles from North to South. There are 7 Elected members in the Westport – Belmullet Municipal District. Monthly Municipal District meetings take place on the last Monday of the month and meetings normally alternate between Westport and Belmullet. The Members work with the Director of Services, Head of Municipal District and all the staff in the Municipal District to support communities in the Municipal District, to improve and maintain infrastructure and to seek funding opportunities for projects which benefit our area from a social or economic prospective.

## 2020 HIGHLIGHTS

- Newport RRDF: An application for Category 2 funding was prepared by the Municipal District and funding of €355,000 was announced in June. The funding will allow a number of interlinked projects at Main Street, Medlicott Street as well as proposed Enterprise Centre to progress to design, Part 8 and land acquisition to reach shovel ready status. Mayo County Council will then be in a position to apply for funding under Category 1 of the RRDF scheme.
- Provision of new cranes at Roonagh and Blacksod. Roonagh: knuckleboom telescopic crane, supplied by EK Marine, cost €194k Spec: SWL 3.0 t at 10m. Blacksod: knuckleboom telescopic crane supplied by SeaQuest Systems, cost €91k Spec: SWL 1.5 t at 10m.
- Completion of substantial roads programmes on Inishturk and Clare Island.
- Provision of new car park for Tidal Pool at Shore Road, Belmullet.
- Significant infrastructural works under Climate Change Adaptation and Active Travel Grant Schemes.
- Amendment of Westport Street Parking Bye-laws. 30 No. new coin and contactless Parking Meters were installed at a cost of €171,000.
- Development of proposals under the Town and Village Renewal (TVRS) and Clar Schemes and ongoing support to community groups to advance projects approved since 2018.
- The Municipal District was awarded funding under the TVRS accelerated measure for a number of projects in 2020
  - Provision of parasols and gazebos. The parasols are now in place in a number of towns and villages. The gazebos are available for festival event organisers in the Municipal District.
  - Installation of awnings. The awnings will facilitate holding of activities/classes etc. in a safer outdoor environment.
  - New Christmas lighting scheme in Westport.
- Provision of support to businesses as they re-opened during the summer e.g. allocation of parking spaces to facilitate additional dining areas outside premises.
