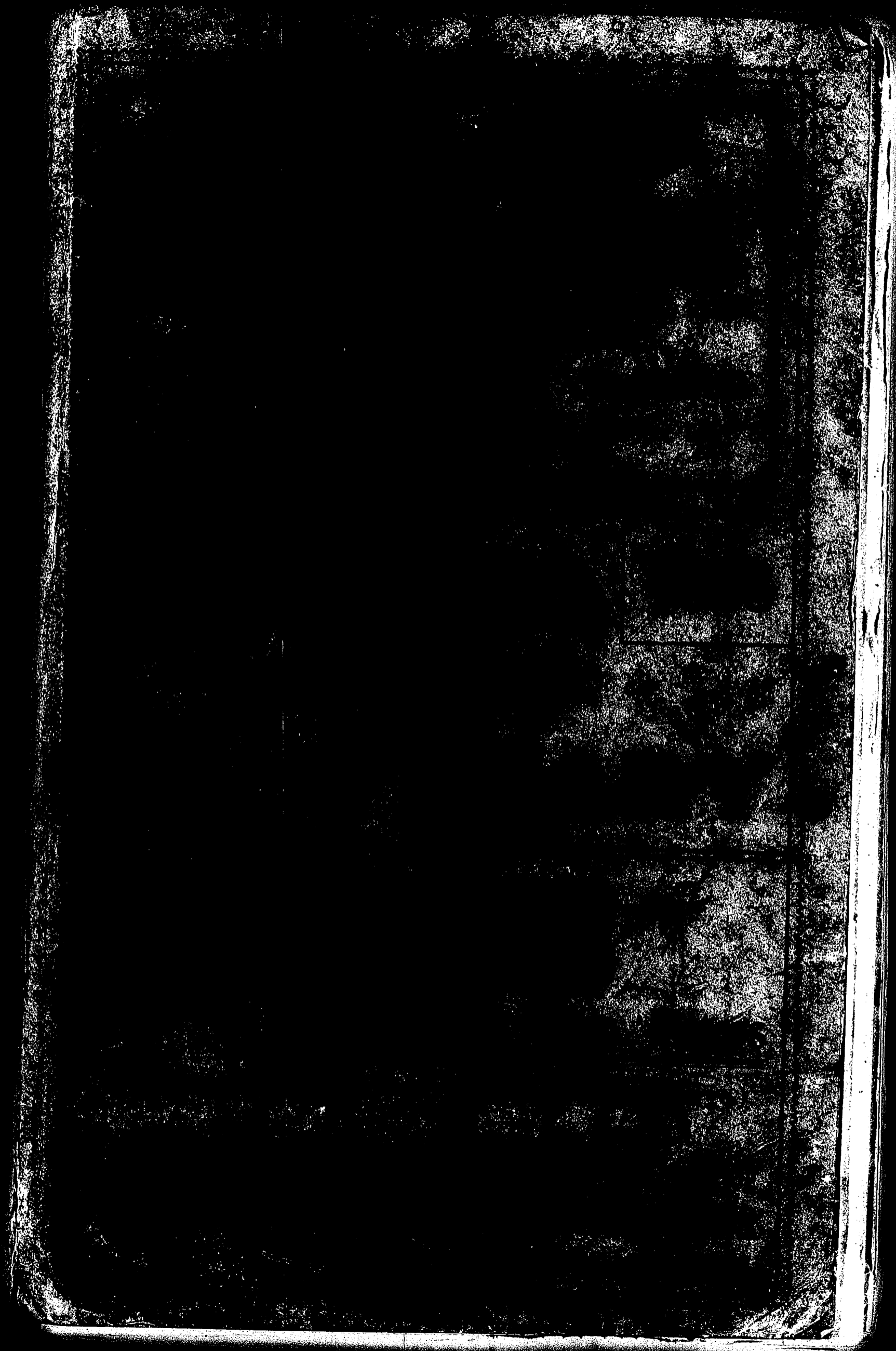

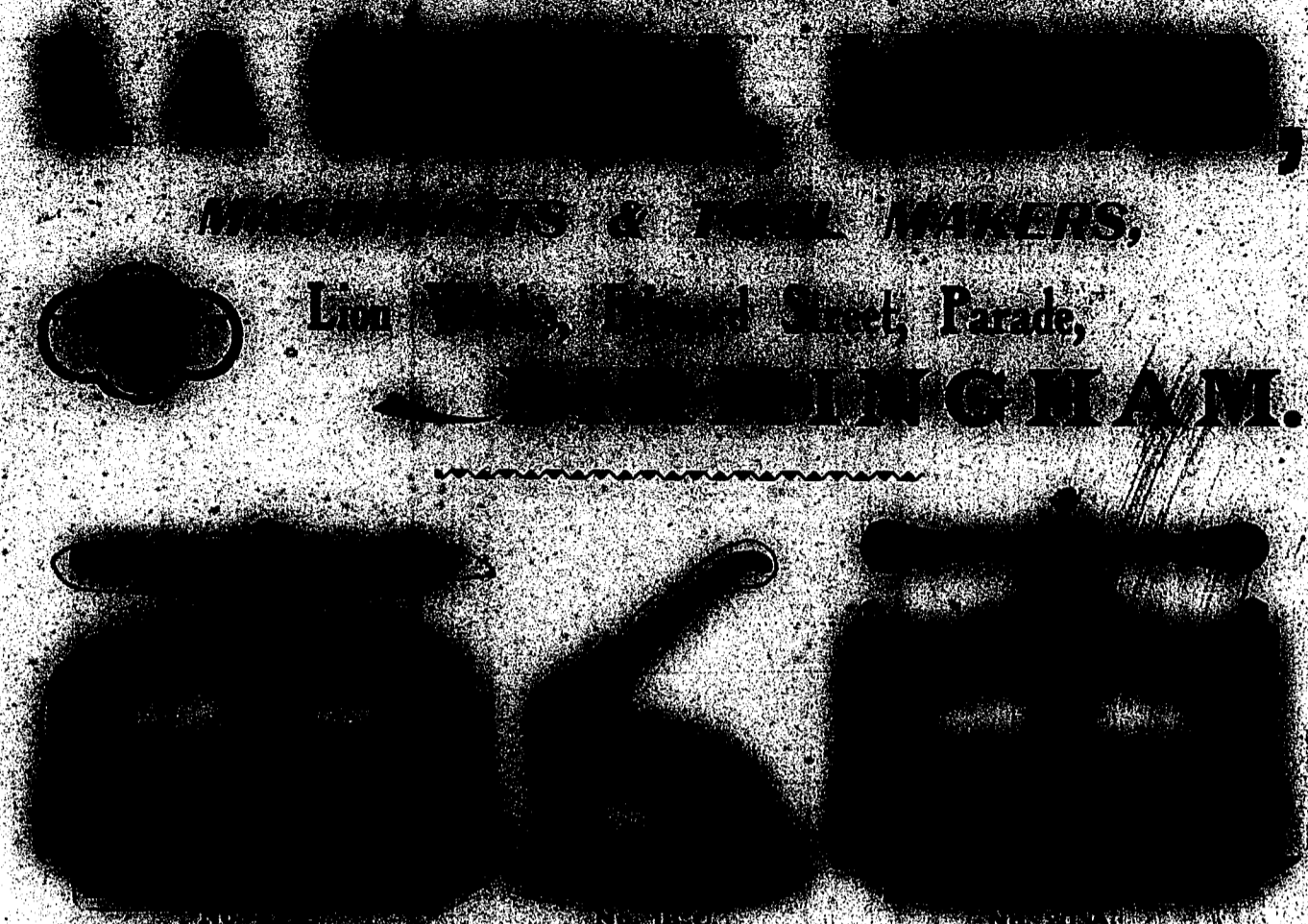

POSTAL REGULATIONS.

GENERAL POST OFFICE.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

INLAND LETTERS—PREPAID RATE.

Not exceeding 4 oz. in weight ... 1d.
For every additional 2 oz. ... 1d.
A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with a double postage; and a letter posted insufficiently prepaid is chargeable with double the deficiency.
No letter may exceed the dimensions of two feet in length, one foot in width, or one foot in depth, unless it be sent to or from one of the Government Offices.
No letter should be posted without prepayment of postage unless it is sent exclusively on the public business. Letters upon public business may be sent to the members of the Government at their respective departments without prepayment, but not elsewhere; and also to certain of the chief permanent officers in each department who are authorized to receive service letters.

REGISTERED LETTERS, &c.

Letters, &c., can be registered in the Public Office, from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m., on Week-days, and from 8 a.m. to 7.40 p.m. on Sundays, and they must be presented for that purpose half an hour at least before the Box is closed for the despatch by which they are to be forwarded; but letters or packets prepaid at the letter rate cannot be accepted for registration unless covered by a proper and well-fastened envelope.
Parcels can be registered at the Parcel Office from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m., on Week-days only.
The Fees payable on registering Inland Letters, Parcels, and other Postal Packets, and the respective limits of Compensation, are as follows:
Fee in addition to postage—2d., 3d., 4d., 5d., 6d., 7d., 8d., 9d., 10d., 11d., 12d., 13d., 14d., 15d., and up to 15s. 10d.
Limit of Compensation, £5, £20, £40, £60, £80, £100, £120, £140, £160, £180, £200, £220, and up to £400.
The sender of a Registered Letter or Parcel may obtain an acknowledgment of its due delivery by prepaying a further fee of 2d.
The sender of an Inland Registered Letter or Parcel, tendered for registration, must write upon the cover, over the address, the word "Registered," and the amount of the Fee proper to the value up to which he desires to secure Compensation, thus—
"Registered, 2d." } and so on.
"Registered, 3d." }

HALFPENNY PACKETS.

The undermentioned articles are transmissible for a postage of One Halfpenny, provided they conform with the regulations, and do not exceed 2 oz. in weight; above that weight they are liable to the letter postage of One Penny for the first 4 oz., and One Halfpenny for every additional 2 oz. Halfpenny packets posted unpaid are charged double postage.
Books, Publications, and works of a literary character (to which written dedications may be added), Sketches, Drawings, Paintings, Photographs, Engravings, Maps, Plans, Charts, The bindings of above articles, provided they are not of a fragile or brittle substance, and the following documents:—Invoices, Orders, Advice Notes, Waybills, Bills of Lading, Receipts, Statements of Accounts, Prices Current, Market Reports, Circulars, Printed Visiting, Invitation, Christmas, Easter or Birthday Cards, MSS. for press-printed proofs, Information for Directories, &c., Educational Exercises, Examination Papers with comments, instructions, &c., Papers for the Blind, Deeds, Agreements, Proposals and Policies of Assurance, Powers of Attorney, Proxy Papers, Voting Papers, Certificate, Licenses, Notices or Returns issued by Officers of a Court of Justice, and by or to local authorities and public bodies and their officers in discharge of their respective duties. Provided that in the case of Invoices and commercial documents, nothing shall appear save dates, names and addresses, particulars and price of goods, or particulars of sums of money, index or reference numbers, etc., etc., and formulas of courtesy or of a conventional character, not exceeding five words. Written requests or instructions, such as "Send," "Forward," or "Cheque will oblige," etc., are not admissible.
Circulars or cards wholly written cannot pass as halfpenny packets, and nothing shall appear in writing except Date, Name and Address, Index or reference, Time and place of meeting; or, in the case of polling cards, Name and Address and Number on Register.
It should be noted that samples of goods, patterns of cloth, etc., cannot be sent at the halfpenny rate.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS AS TO HALFPENNY PACKETS.

1. A halfpenny packet may not exceed 2 feet in length and 1 foot in width or depth.
2. Every halfpenny packet is subject to examination in the post.

3. Every halfpenny packet must be posted either without a cover, or in an unfastened envelope, or in a cover which can be easily removed for the purpose of examination without breaking any seal or tearing any paper or separating any adhering surfaces. A packet posted without a cover may not be fastened or otherwise treated so as to prevent easy examination.
4. No halfpenny packet may contain or bear any communication in the nature of a letter not being matter coming within the definition of such packet or being otherwise expressly allowed.
5. (1) No paper money (money orders and postal orders) may be posted or conveyed or delivered by post in a halfpenny packet.
(2) This rule does not apply to a halfpenny packet containing a stamped proxy paper, or to a halfpenny paper containing a stamped and addressed post card, wrapper or envelope forwarded by the sender of the packet in order that such card, wrapper or envelope may be returned through the post to such sender, or some person designated by him.
6. If any of the rules relating to a halfpenny packet be infringed, the halfpenny packet will be treated as a letter.

POST CARDS—INLAND.

Official Post Cards, impressed with a halfpenny stamp, and official reply Post Cards impressed with a halfpenny stamp on each portion of them, can be bought at every Post Office.
Nothing whatever may be attached except adhesive stamps in payment of additional postage or stamp-duty; and a gummed label, not to exceed 2 inches long by 1-inch wide, bearing the address at which the card is to be delivered. The card may not be folded nor may it be cut or altered in such a way as to reduce the size below 4 x 2½ inches, nor must not exceed 5½ inches in length nor 3½ inches in width. Stamps in payment of postage must be affixed to the face of the card (i.e., to the side which bears the address). A Post Card may not be fastened against inspection in any way, nor enclosed in a cover of any kind, but may contain matter, printed or otherwise, on the front if the right-hand half be reserved exclusively for stamps and address. If any of these rules be infringed, the card is treated as a letter, and liable on delivery to the usual charges.

NEWSPAPERS—INLAND.

Inland Newspapers are subject to the following regulations:—
They must be printed and published in the United Kingdom, must be published in numbers at intervals of not more than seven days.
For each Inland Newspaper, whether posted singly or with others in a packet, the postage, when prepaid, is One Halfpenny; but a packet containing two or more registered Newspapers is not chargeable with a higher rate of postage than would be chargeable on a book-packet of the same weight. For each transmission a fresh postage must be paid.
A Newspaper, or a packet of Newspapers, posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage; if insufficiently paid, with double the deficiency.
The postage must be prepaid, either by an adhesive stamp or by the use of a stamped wrapper.
Every Newspaper or packet of Newspapers must be posted either without a cover, or in a cover open at both ends, and so that same can easily be removed for the purpose of examination.
No Newspaper and no cover of a Newspaper may bear anything (not being part of the Newspaper) except the name and addresses of the sender and the addressee, a request for return in case of non-delivery, the title of the Newspaper, and a reference to any page or place in the Newspaper to which the attention of the addressee is directed.
No unregistered publication and no article (unless it be a part or supplement of the Newspaper) may be posted in the same cover with the Newspaper.
In case any Newspaper or packet of Newspapers infringes any of the three last mentioned rules, it is charged as an insufficiently paid letter, or is transferred to the Parcel Post and charged a fine of 1d. in addition to any deficient parcel postage.
Every Newspaper must be so folded as to admit of the title being readily inspected.
No packet of Newspapers must exceed five pounds in weight, nor may it exceed two feet in length or one foot in width or depth.

PARCELS POST—INLAND.

Parcels are accepted at any Post Office in the United Kingdom for transmission by the Inland Parcels Post under the following general conditions in regard to weight, dimensions, and rates of postage, viz.:

WEIGHTS AND POSTAGE.

FOR AN INLAND POSTAL PARCEL of a weight of	The Rate of Postage to be Pre-paid in Ordinary Postage Stamps, will be—
Not exceeding 1 lb. ...	3d.
Exceeding 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs. ...	4d.

And so on, 1d. for every additional pound.	
No Parcel can be sent exceeding 11 lbs. in weight.	

POSTAL REGULATIONS.

NEWSPAPER, BOOK POST, AND PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST, ETC.

For Newspapers, Books, and Printed Papers generally, 1d. per 2 oz.
For Patterns and Samples, 1d. per 2 oz.; but with a minimum charge of 1d.
For Commercial Papers, 1d. per 2 oz.; but with a minimum charge of 2½d.
PATTERNS or SAMPLES sent abroad must not be of intrinsic value.

FOREIGN PARCEL POST.

The dimensions are the same as for the Inland Parcel Post, except for European countries (not including Constantinople), 2 feet in any direction; for Canada, length, 2 feet; breadth or depth, 1 foot.
A declaration of the contents and their value must accompany every parcel. Customs duty is collected on delivery. Parcels for Foreign Countries, Cape Colony, neighbouring parts of South Africa, the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, Jamaica, the Straits Settlements and Trinidad must not contain a Letter.
A Certificate of Posting may be obtained, if desired, by the person posting a Foreign Parcel.

GENERAL POST OFFICE, SACKVILLE STREET, DUBLIN.

THE PUBLIC OFFICE is open on week days, from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. for all Postal work, and on Sundays, Good Friday, and Christmas Day, from 8 to 10 a.m., and from 3.40 to 7.40 p.m. At the Telegraph Counter, however, Postage Stamps, etc., may be obtained at all times when the Postal Counter is closed.
The Returned Letter Office, and The Missing Letter and Enquiry Branch of the Secretary's Office, open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. (6 p.m. on Saturdays).
The Money Order, Postal Order Savings Bank and Insurance and Annuity Offices are open from 8 a.m. until 8 p.m. daily. These Offices are not opened on Sundays.
REGISTRATION.—The British Registration Fee on every Registered Letter, Newspaper or Book Packet posted in the United Kingdom for any British Colony or Country in the Postal Union is 2d.
No Letter or other Postal Packet addressed to initials, or to a fictitious name, can be registered.
The Commission on Inland Money Orders issued is as under—
For sums not exceeding £1 ... 2d.
" above £1 and not exceeding £3 ... 3d.
" above £3 and not exceeding £10 ... 4d.
" above £10 and not exceeding £20 ... 6d.
" above £20 and not exceeding £30 ... 8d.
" above £30 and not exceeding £40 ... 10d.

POSTAL ORDERS.

The following are the amounts for which Postal Orders are issued, together with the Poundage payable in respect of each Order, viz.:—6d., 1/-, 1/6, 2/-, or 2/6 Poundage, 1d.; 3/-, 3/6, 4/-, 4/6, 5/-, 5/6, 6/-, 6/6, 7/-, 7/6, 8/-, 8/6, 9/-, 9/6, 10/-, 10/6, 11/-, 11/6, 12/-, 12/6, 13/-, 13/6, 14/-, 14/6 or 15/-, Poundage, 1d.; 15/6, 16/-, 16/6, 17/-, 17/6, 18/-, 18/6, 19/-, 19/6, 20/- or 21/-, Poundage, 1½d.
Broken amounts, but not fractions of a penny, may be made up by the use of British Postage Stamps, not exceeding five pence in value affixed to the face of any one Postal Order. Perforated Stamps cannot be accepted for this purpose.

DELIVERIES OF LETTERS IN DUBLIN.

The First Delivery at 7 a.m., includes letters received by night mail from England and by Irish Provincial night mails, those posted at Suburban boxes up to 12 midnight and 12.30 a.m., at Town District Boxes up to 1.30 a.m., and at the Chief Office up to 6 a.m.
The Second Delivery at 12 noon includes letters from Scotland, via Belfast and from places on the Kingstown line, and also from many of the Provincial towns; Letters posted at the Suburban Sub-Offices and Pillar-boxes up to 10.15 a.m., at boxes within the Town limits up to 10.30 and 11 a.m., and at the Chief Office up to 11.45 a.m.
The Third Delivery at 2.20 p.m. includes letters from North of England and Scotland, received via Stranraer and Larne, and from some of the Northern Towns; also from places on the Kingstown and Wexford lines, and letters posted at the Town Sub-Offices and Pillar-boxes up to 1 and 1.15 p.m., and at the Chief Office up to 2.15 p.m.
The Fourth Delivery at 6.10 p.m. includes letters received by day mail from England, those posted at Suburban Offices and Pillar-boxes up to 3.30 and 4 p.m., at offices and boxes in the Town Districts up to 3.45 and 4.15 p.m., and at the Chief Office up to 5.20 p.m.
The Fifth Delivery, at 8 p.m., includes letters received by day mails from Provincial Towns in Ireland, and letters posted at Suburban Sub-Offices and Pillar-boxes up to 5 and 5.15 p.m., at boxes within the Town Districts up to 5.30 p.m., at College-green Branch Office up to 7 p.m., and at the Chief Office up to 7.15 p.m.
On Sunday there is but one Delivery, commencing about 7 a.m., in the several Districts. This Delivery includes the Irish and English correspondence and letters posted in Suburban District boxes up to 12.30 a.m., and Town District boxes up to 1.30 a.m., and at the Chief Office up to 6 a.m.

DIMENSIONS.
The dimensions allowed on an Inland Postal Parcel are:—
Maximum length ... 3 ft. 6 in.
Maximum length and girth combined ... 6 ft. 0 in.

EXAMPLES.—

A parcel measuring 3 ft. 6 in. in its longest dimensions may measure as much as 2 ft. 6 in. in girth, i.e., around its thickest part; or—
A shorter parcel may be thicker; e.g.—if measuring no more than 3 feet in length, it may measure as much as 3 feet in girth, i.e., around its thickest part.
The most convenient mode of measuring is by means of a tape 6 feet long, having the length of 3 feet 6 inches marked thereon. So much of the tape as is not used in measuring the length is the measure of the maximum girth permissible. Such a tape may conveniently be marked in one colour up to 3 feet 6 inches, and the remaining portion in another colour.
Parcels are received, on week days only, at the Public Office, G.P.O. (corner of Sackville-street and Prince's-street), from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m., and at the Parcel Office, Amiens-street, from 8.20 a.m. to 7 p.m. Parcels for despatch by the Night Mails to the Provinces, and by the Night Mail to England, can be posted at the Parcel Handling In Office, G.P.O., up to 5.45 p.m.; but such parcels can be posted at the Parcel Office, Amiens-street, up to 6.15 p.m.
The Sub-Offices in Dublin and its Suburbs are open for the receipt of Parcels from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. From all the Sub-Offices in the Town and Principal Suburbs there are three daily collections of Parcels, at the hours specified in the Window Notices at the respective Offices. The Parcels collected up to 4.30 p.m. are in time for all the evening despatches from the Chief Office. The Town Collections are made at 3 p.m., 4.30 p.m., and 6.30 p.m., respectively.
There are five deliveries of Parcels in Dublin on week days, but no delivery on Sunday.

POST OFFICE TELEGRAPHS—INLAND.

The charge for Telegrams throughout the United Kingdom, including the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, the Orkney and Shetland Islands, is 6d. for the first 12 words and 1d. for each subsequent word. The receiver's name and address are charged for as part of the telegram, and the name and address of the sender—if they are to be transmitted—are also charged for as part of the telegram. If the latter are not to be transmitted they should be written in the space provided for the purpose on the back of the Form.
This charge covers the cost of delivery by a special foot messenger within the limits of the Postmen's free delivery from any head office, and at all places within three miles of the Terminal Telegraph Office.
The Chief Telegraph Station in Dublin is at the General Post Office, Sackville-street, which is always open (night and day) for the receipt and transmission of telegrams.
A telegram for a place of business is not deposited in the Door Letter Box. If no one be in attendance to receive it, the messenger (before 9 a.m.) drops an advice of its arrival into the Door Letter Box, in order that the owner may send to the Telegraph Office, Sackville-street, for it.
Telegrams may be repeated at the request of the sender, if he desire to adopt this extra security against risk of error. The charge for repetition is one-half the ordinary tariff.
Telegrams may be re-directed from town to town for a fresh charge, at the ordinary inland rate, or within the same town for a charge of 6d.

SAVINGS BANK.

Deposits of One Shilling, or of any number of Shillings, or of Pounds and Shillings, may be made by any person at the Post Office Savings Bank, provided that each Depositor shall not make deposits amounting to more than £50 in any year, ending the 31st December, and £200 in all, inclusive of interest. When any Depositor's principal and interest amount together to more than £200, interest will be paid on £200 only.
Interest at the rate of £2 10s. per cent. per annum is allowed on deposits.
Postal Orders, money orders, and cheques (unless crossed to a particular Bank) are accepted for the purpose of Savings Bank Deposits.
Any person desirous of saving one shilling by penny contributions, for deposit in the Post Office Savings Bank, may do so by purchasing with each penny saved a postage stamp, and affixing it to a form to be obtained at any Post Office, which form, when 12 such stamps have been so affixed, will be received as a deposit of one shilling.
Sums not exceeding £1 may now be withdrawn without the usual three days' notice, on Depositor giving a receipt and lodging his Pass Book, which will be returned to him in two or three days.

or 2½d. according to destination.
For Post Cards (single 1d.) Reply Post Card ... 2d.
All other places in the Postal Union:—
For Letters not exceeding half an ounce ... 2½d.
Post Card (single 1d.) Reply Post Card ... 2d.

MAYO COUNTY COUNCIL.

Report of the County Surveyor for the information of the Ballinrobe Rural District Council at a Quarterly Meeting to be held on Monday, 3rd May, 1909.

Mr. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

Generally speaking the surfaces of the public roads under contract in your District have been kept in a reasonable condition of repair during the last three months, with a few exceptions, which latter is usually the case. The great bulk of balances due last October have now been given, but they could have been applied with much better advantage and less waste if supplied on the specified date. It seems this default is almost incurable under the present contract system. Side-dressing on most roads has not been done as required.

Gradually, projecting tree, bush and hedge branches are being removed, which is a vast improvement. Field and tail drains in places will require scouring out, deepening and widening, and I hope to deal with this matter wholesale shortly. Certain sections of the main roads, especially in the neighbourhood of Hollymount, suffer much owing to the heavy timber traffic coming on them recently, and this injury seems to be getting worse.

Loose stones are not regularly removed, which is most objectionable both for horses and bicycles, to say nothing of motor cars.

I hope contractors will not neglect to pick down with pick axes rough and high surfaces during the coming summer weather, when the roads are hard. A great deal of surface shaping and correction can be done in this manner without the application of much material. The main road to Partry shows improvement, owing to the more regular attention given to it, and the District roads show some improvement since last quarter.

My list of applications is of an ordinary kind, save the rebuilding of the Irish College Bridge (Tourmakeady), which ought to be carried out this coming quarter, and all the money applied for this work is required, since the span will be greater and the foundation very deep to insure solidity.

There is only one District Councillor's application (Shrule watering place), and that item is on my list also.

The Bohain Bridge is well in hands as I write and one abutment nearly completed.

My list of Certificates is for quarter ending March 31, 1909.

The owners of fixed fisheries are to pay licence-duty for the engines used therein, according to the above scale, and the difference between the total amount of such licence-duty, and the amount of 10 per cent. on the Poor Law valuation of the same, if the latter exceed the former; such difference to be paid in two half-yearly gales, on the first day of February, and 1st day of July. Licences are sold and issued by the several stamp distributors and sub-distributors.

The 1st section of the 11th and 12th Vic., c. 92, exempts from duty rods used singly for taking trout, perch, pike, or other fish except salmon.
