In the sum of £61:8:7 is included a sum of £19:7:11 which represents the loss occasioned by the immediate sale of certain provisions owing to the occupation of the workhouse by the Military Authorities without due notice. The real consumption for Provisions and Necessaries was £42:0:8 or an average weekly cost of 9/5½.
