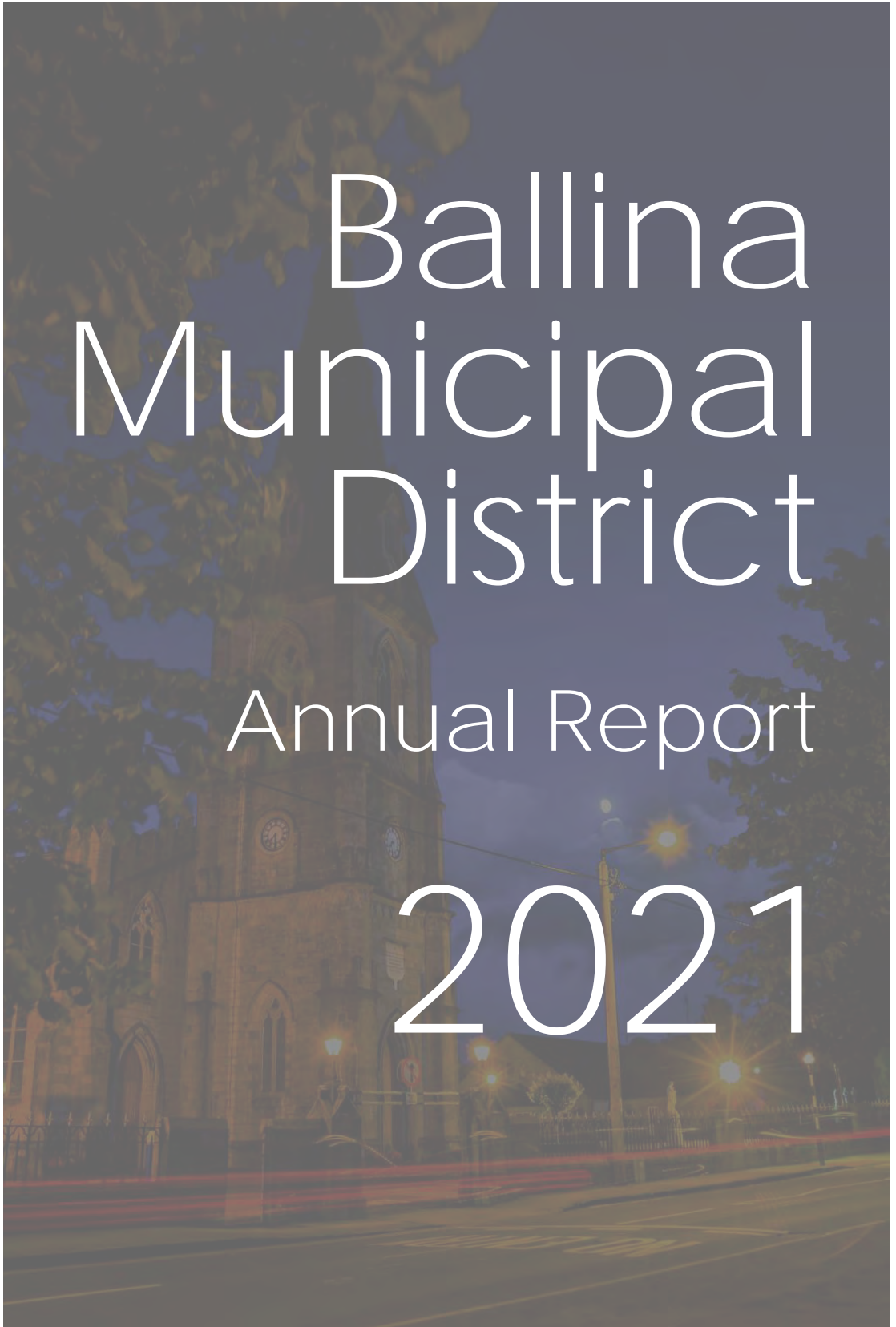

I welcome the opportunity to look back on the work of Ballina Municipal District during 2021, a year in which we were faced with further major and rapid changes to our established way of working. As an organisation we responded quickly and efficiently and remained focused on our core functions which is the delivery of public services to the people of our District.

I am heartened to see that while our front doors were closed for several months, many vital and essential services carried on and everyone adapted quickly to an online and virtual experience.

This Report outlines some of the work of the Council in delivering public services and infrastructural projects during the year. In April, the Councillors agreed the Schedule of Works for the District. This provided for a total expenditure of over €8 million on such services as housing maintenance, roads, parks and open spaces, street cleaning, Jackie Clarke Collection and Burial Grounds.

The allocation of funding under various schemes greatly assisted in the development of our towns and villages. Schemes such as CLÁR, Town & Village Renewal, local funding from Ballina Municipal District through the General Municipal Allocation gave communities a much-needed boost.

The year was also marked by sadness following the death of two former Councillors, Mr. Vinny Munnelly, Killala and Mr. Jimmy Glacken, Bonniconlon, both who served this area with diligence and pride. Go dtuga siad suaimhneas.

Finally, I would like to sincerely thank you, the Councillors and also the staff for working with great dedication for the people of the District. I commend your commitment and look forward to continued progress. Whilst we have come through very difficult times and many people are still experiencing the impacts of COVID, the District must look forward in hope to 2022 when we will see many important projects completed and new ones commence.

I am confident, given the abilities and spirit of cooperation that is consistently shown by the Councillors and staff that we should be able to meet the challenges that lie ahead.

We can look forward to a more positive 2022.

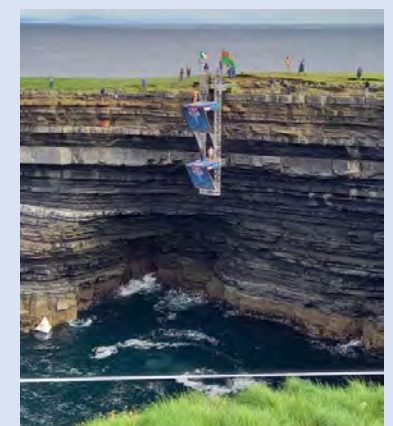

CASTLEBAR MUNICIPAL DISTRICT

Castlebar Municipal District governs the town of Castlebar and the general Castlebar area. It has a population of 30,000 and has 28 Electoral Divisions.

There are 7 elected Members in Castlebar Municipal District since the Local Elections in June 2019 and they meet on the last Wednesday of every month to discuss the development and implementation of policies across a broad range of areas. The members work closely with the Director of Service, Head of Municipal District, the Senior Executive Engineer and the support staff of Mayo County Council to ensure that the Castlebar area continues to thrive, both socially and economically.

The town of Castlebar is actively twinned with Hochstadt in Germany, Auray in France, and in the USA, Dixon, Illinois, Westchester, New York State and Peekshill, also in New York State. These are seen as important cultural links.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS

- › **Christmas Lighting Event:** The turning on of the Christmas Lights took place at Market Square in November. Pictured below is Cllr. Martin McLoughlin, Cathaoirleach who switched on the lights and also in attendance are elected members of Castlebar Municipal District.
- › **Visit of Jack Chambers TD:** Jack Chambers, T.D., Minister of State for Gaeltacht and Sport visited Lough Lannagh Leisure Complex on the 11th July, 2021 alongside Cathaoirleach Martin McLoughlin and elected members of Castlebar Municipal District, Alan Dillon T.D and Senator Lisa Chambers to review the Lough Lannagh Masterplan and the proposal for a climbing wall at the Leisure Centre.
- › **Outdoor Dining on Tucker Street:** Seven local restaurants came together to work alongside Mayo County Council in creating a unique dining experience on the street, this commenced on the 6th July, 2021 and ran until the 5th October, 2021.

The street was transformed into a continental style dining space where the tables are taken from the restaurants and set up on the street.



- **Moore Hall Developments:** Some development works have been carried out to transform the grounds and gardens at the historic estate of Moore Hall. The works included the restoration of the Walled Garden, which had fallen into disrepair, as well as new visitor facilities including walkways, seating, play areas and signage. Funding of €350,000 for Moore Hall was approved under the Rural Development (LEADER) and Cross Border Co-operation Programmes.



- **Glenisland Bridge:** Deputy Hildegard Naughton, T.D., Minister of State at the Department of Transport TD, officially opened the R312 Glenisland Bridge Scheme on the 1st November, 2021 alongside Cllr. Martin McLoughlin, Cathaoirleach, Cllr. Michael Kilcoyne, Cllr. Al McDonnell, Cllr. Cyril Burke, Cllr. Blackie Gavin, Cllr. Donna Sheridan, Cllr. Sean Carey, Alan Dillon, T.D., Maria Walsh, M.E.P, Senator Lisa Chambers, Dara Calleary, T.D., and Kevin Kelly, Chief Executive.



The R312 is a strategic connection to the Erris region of Northwest of Mayo, which serves a very large rural catchment area and is the largest Gaeltacht area in Mayo. It is of particular importance to the economical, tourism and regional development of the Erris Region and is the main access from South Mayo and further afield. The purpose of this scheme was to replace a section of carriageway which was substandard in width and alignment and provide a new safer realigned section of carriageway.

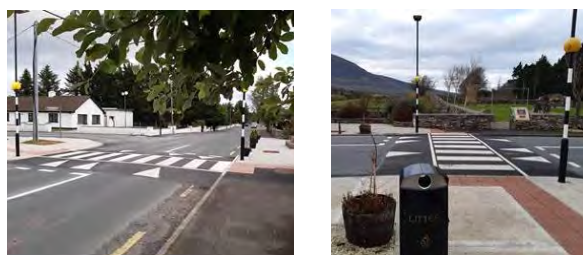
- **Promotion of Mayo's Historical Houses and Gardens:** A two-part documentary titled Discovering Mayo's Historical Houses and Gardens was produced by Atlantic productions. The series featured Moore Hall & the National Museum of Ireland – Country Life. The programme was broadcasted on the 1st July 2021 on SKY Channel 191.

- **Bofeenau Playground:** The official opening of Bofeenau playground took place on the 29th June, 2021 and was carried out by Cathaoirleach Cllr Blackie Gavin.



Also in attendance were Cllr. Michael Kilcoyne, Cllr. Martin McLoughlin and Rose Conway-Walsh T.D.

- **Lahardane Town & Village:** Town and Village Grant funding was awarded to Mayo County Council under the Town & Village Renewal Scheme. The objective of the project was to enhance the adjacent public realm and memorial park approach and in particular to improve footway surfaces, create widened standing areas and to facilitate visitors crossing the carriageway by reducing the width of the carriageway and the installation of a pedestrian crossing.



- **Town & Village Renewal Scheme: Bofeenau Community Hall Remedial Works.** Under the Town & Village Renewal Scheme with matched funding provided by Mayo County Council, the project was to carry out essential remedial works and to support a Rural Broadband Hub. This is a partnership project with Bofeenau Community Council. The project involved a remedial works intervention strategy to address the significant issue of damp and moisture ingress in addition to wall insulation, upgraded access arrangements, upgrade works including wiring, electrical and data trunking for the broadband hub. **Broadband Connection Points (BCPs)** are public locations which have been selected to receive 150Mb high-speed broadband connectivity in the first year of the National Broadband Plan. 10 locations were selected in County Mayo including Bofeenau Community Centre.



- **A new turnkey development of 9 three bedroom semi-detached houses acquired at Heathervale, Castlebar**



- > **Castlebar Urban Greenway Link Project** Funding of €2.5 million has been secured under the Urban Regeneration Development Fund (URDF) from the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government to develop the last remaining town centre section of the Greenway from Lough Lannagh, Castlebar, to Turlough.

The URDF fund is a government initiative under Project Ireland 2040 as part of a commitment to balanced regional development.

The Great Western Greenway in County Mayo, which is deemed a model of sustainable thinking, now links vast areas of the county and was extended from Westport in 2015 to connect Islandeady, Castlebar and Turlough House Park and Gardens (National Museum of Country Life).

The signing of contract for the Castlebar Urban Greenway Link Project took place on the 9th March, 2021 in the Castlebar Municipal District Chamber.

In attendance were Councillor Blackie Gavin, Cathaoirleach, Ciaran McTigue of Paraic McTigue Contractors Castlebar Ltd., Padraig Kelly, Executive Architect, Mayo County Council, and Iarla Moran, Head of the Castlebar Municipal District.

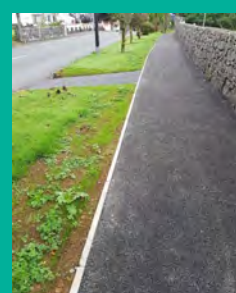

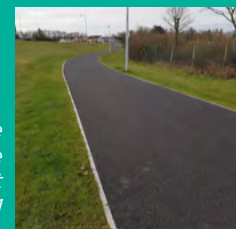

2021 IN NUMBERS

11 Castlebar Municipal District meetings were held in 2021, including the Annual General meeting. Meetings were held online from January to May.

25 Burial Ground Committees in the Castlebar Municipal District area received funding of **€28,000** from the General Municipal Allocation.

Councillors agreed a General Municipal Allocation of **€41,000** each to fund clubs, communities, festival & event organisers and residents associations.

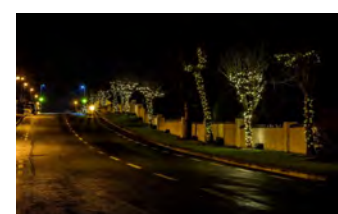

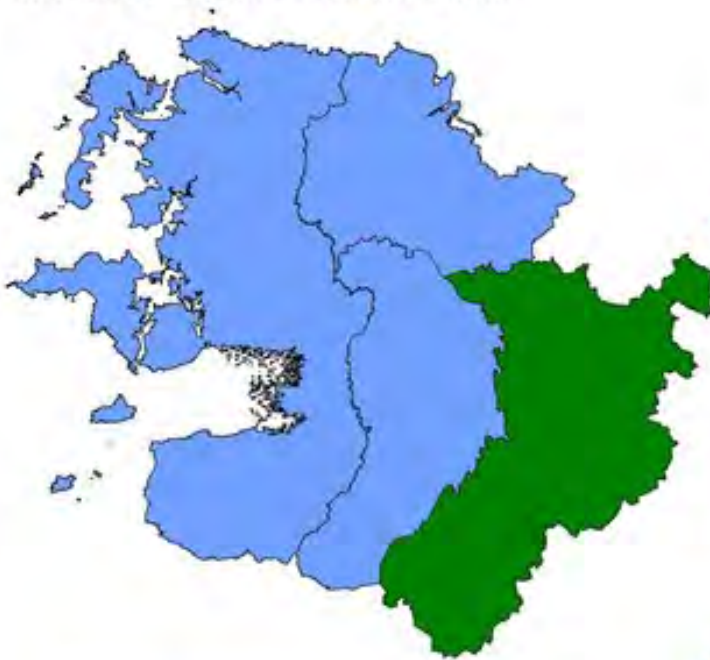

The Claremorris - Swinford Municipal District Serves:

- One third of the County’s population
- One third of the County’s elected representatives
- Almost two fifths of the total road network
- Seven of the twelve towns in the County with a population greater than 1,000

It consists of the Claremorris Electoral Area, with 6 elected representatives, and the Swinford Electoral Area, with 4 elected representatives. 10 Meetings were held in 2021 including the Annual General Meeting. The Annual General Meeting took place on 30th June 2021. Councillor Neil Cruise was elected Cathaoirleach and Councillor John Cribben was elected Leas-Cathaoirleach.

The year 2021 was dominated by the Global Covid-19 Pandemic with Mayo County Council having to respond and deliver quality services in a Covid-19 Environment. The pandemic changed the way business is conducted, resulting in socially distanced and online Municipal District Meetings, staff rotas and remote working arrangements.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS

- With the introduction of the new active travel grants, circa 3.7 million in funding allowed for the extension of footpaths and cycle networks across the District. Key projects were at Dispensary Rd. Foxford, Chapel Lane Claremorris, the Neale Rd. Ballinrobe, Knock Rd, Ballyhaunis and Claremount Claremorris.
- The improvement works at Lisroughrey Junction, Cong, has opened access to Lisroughrey and leaves safe access to the pier, the Corrib cruises tourist attractions and to future developments in Lisroughrey, including the proposed development of ‘Daisy Lodge’ a respite home for sick children.
- New Housing Developments were constructed in Ballinrobe and Ballyhaunis, while houses were allocated to families and individuals on the Council’s waiting list at the newly constructed development at Kilkelly Road, Swinford.
- The Climate Adaption and Resilience Funding of circa €500,000, allowed for remedial works at twenty-five locations where flooding frequently occurred.
- The Clár Scheme at Aghamore provided carparks, footpaths and associated access roads to the Community Centre in Aghamore.
- Four Community Involvements Schemes were completed at Gortgarve, Kiltimagh, Cloonagashel, Bloomfield and Claremount at a value of circa €360,000.

2021 IN NUMBERS

Rebuilding Ireland Housing Loans

- 9 Loan Applications in the Claremorris-Swinford Municipal District area were received as part of the Rebuilding Ireland Programme, during 2021. 6 no. Loan Approvals issued, and the total amount approved was €625,700.

Housing Grant Schemes

- 137 Housing Aid for Older People Grants, 72 Mobility Aids Grants and 34 Housing Adaptation for Persons with a Disability Grants were received under the Housing Grant Schemes. Properties that were approved for funding in 2021 were at a cost of €93,101.90 Claremorris, €65,586.49 Ballinrobe, and €61,198.54, Swinford, respectively.

General Municipal Allocation (GMA)

- €700,000 GMA funding was allocated to the Claremorris-Swinford Municipal District for 2021. This funding was distributed between Capital and Community Projects. The Members funded applications for Grant Aid under Residents Associations, Clubs/Community Organisations, Festivals/Events and Burial Ground Committees. A budget of €60,000 was allocated to 53 Burial Grounds in 2021.

Road Transportation and Safety

- Over 17 million funding was received under the Roads Works Scheme in 2021 with respect to the Claremorris – Swinford Municipal District.

National Roads Construction works commenced on the N26 Cloongullaun Bridge with a total cost circa of €20 million.

Regional Roads A total budget of circa €1.61 million was availed of for regional road strengthening works.

Local Roads A circa 4.5 million was availed of with respect to local road strengthening works.

Surface Restoration Programme A budget of 1.8 million was availed of.

Drainage works were carried out to a value of circa €12,000.

Hedge-cutting on local roads amounted to €150,000.

Local Improvement Schemes 51 were completed to a total value of circa €309,000.

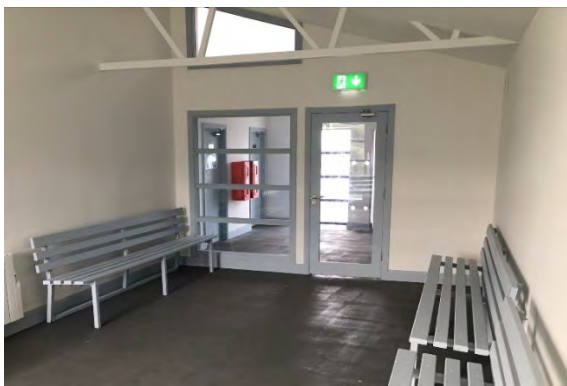
