Historical general note.

Dalton's "Archdiocese of Tuam" page 323. Islandeady parish: little of civil or ecclesiastical history. In 16th century the O'Neills ruled the area up to 12th century. In 16th century the Butlers held sway and in the 17th century most of the district was owned by Sir Roger Palmer.

What was not owned by Palmer was owned by Brown of Kilmac and by Kilmaine. These two owned the parish in 1800. Brown resided in the area.

The Young took a heavy toll of his area. Dalton gives an account of a Patrick Whigham who obtained a teaching post but who got no pay for three days and when wife died, starvation caused him to starve to death. Unable to purchase a coffin he buried her at night so as not to leave a day's work in order that his children might not die of starvation.

Also of a Bridget Joyce who died & remained eight days unburied.
