### TOPOGRAPHY

*Brief description of outstanding scenic views in the district, natural attractions, or unusual topographical features.*

The parish is situated between Kiltully (N.) a few houses of which down it includes, Ballyhamis (2 1/2 miles from southern boundary) and Knock, a few miles west of its western limit. In the north-west it runs to within a few miles of Kiltinagh. Its eastern boundary is the county line; its north-eastern to parish of Kilmoree. Greatest length about 7 miles. (N.W to S.E.) greatest breadth about 6 miles.

Generally the area is not rich. Its topography is mainly of rolling country; green fields, tilled land, patches of timber with an

None of imposing character. Mannin House owned by Mr. Grogan's ordinary - there was an estate of which this was the centre - owned by the Boyloughs. The estate was divided by the Land Commission who when dismantling the portion of the house found a stone slab (still to be seen) with the inscription. - Gerald Dillon of An Annin and Ellis O'Leary his wife ordered this coat of arms to be c-- forth.

Portion of inscription missing. Above it is carved the name Costello next with "Dum Spiro Spero" - the family motto.
