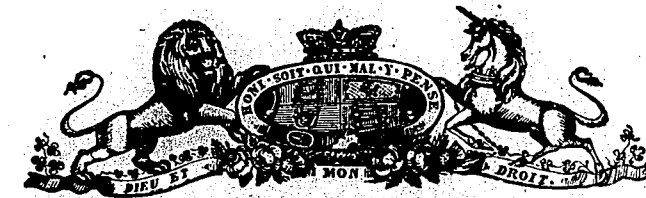

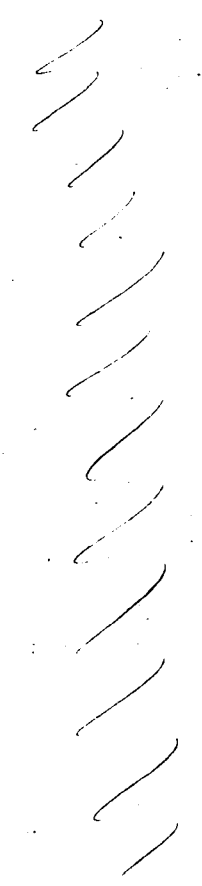

The following Orders of the Local Government Board for Ireland were laid before the Board and directions given thereon, as follows:—

The following Letters, from the Local Government Board for Ireland and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them respectively, as follows):—

Special Letter from Local Government Board No. 9518/1874, dated 25 May, 1874, forwarding for payment by the Board of Guardians the Retaining Officers Account of Expenses attending the General Collection of Guardians in all each last, amounting to thirteen shillings and six pence. The Clerk was directed to pay the amount out of Kelly's Excessions, and to produce the bills and receipts at the next meeting of the Board.

Letter from same No. 9522/1874, dated 27 May 1874 - forwarding therewith for the information of the Board of Guardians a Letter which they have received from John Cunningham in reference to his tender for the supply of straw to the workhouse, and requesting that the letter may be returned to their Office with the Guardians' observations thereon.

In reference to the Letter addressed by Mr John Cunningham, of Korbarr, to the Local Government Board for Ireland, the Board of Guardians desires to state that on the 12<sup>th</sup> of all each last, tenders for supply of straw were received from

from Mr Cunningham and Mr Patrick Tappin - Mr Cunningham's price being 1/6 per statute box, and Mr Tappin's 1/6. The tenders were duly considered and it was not considered advisable to accept either of them, on the 21<sup>st</sup> of all each last, an order was made to advertise for fresh tenders for supply of straw, which was to be considered on the 14<sup>th</sup> all next, and on that day only one tender was received, namely:— from Mr Tappin, who agreed to supply straw from 30<sup>th</sup> Sept 1874 to 29<sup>th</sup> Sept 1875, at 1/6 per statute box. The Board adjourned the consideration of Mr Tappin's tender to the 27<sup>th</sup> all next, and having sent for him to the Board Room he consented to reduce the price to 1/6 per statute box in consideration of his being afforded increased facilities for supplying straw, and the Board of Guardians accepted his tender at that price.

Mr John Cunningham did not tender on the 14<sup>th</sup> all next, he sent a tender on the 27<sup>th</sup> all next, not dated, which the Board of Guardians could not for the following reasons entertain:—

- 1<sup>st</sup>. It was not sent in on the proper date, the 14<sup>th</sup> all next.
- 2<sup>d</sup>. It was not in conformity with the terms of the advertisement which required security to the extent of £200.

Mr Cunningham's tender sent in on the 27<sup>th</sup> all next, and marked copies of advertisements of 19 February 1874, and on 1<sup>st</sup> April 1874, are enclosed with minutes for the information of the Local Government Board.

Resolved that the Board receive the tender of Mr Timothy Shames, to burn the floors of the Female Infirmary ward, for a sum of thirteen pounds.

No. 22547/1874. dated 21<sup>st</sup> October 1874. referring to the amount of remuneration to Mr. Thomas Grady, Post-Rate Collector, for the duties devolving on him as Sanitary Sub-Officer under the Public Health Act, and stating that as the Guardians are better acquainted with the nature of the duties which Mr. Grady will be called on to perform as Sanitary Sub-Officer, they should themselves suggest a provisional remuneration for the approval of the Local Government Board.

In reference to the foregoing Letter it is Resolved that the Local Government Board be informed that Mr. Grady is paid by the rate of six pence in the pound on the amount of rates collected by him in the Electoral Divisions of Bang and Thurston and the fees paid to Mr. Grady in any local sold and exceeds £12, and he would not accept the office of Sanitary Sub-Officer to any Parish or any provisional establishment to his fees, and in all the circumstances of the case and having regard to the nature of the duties which he will be called on to perform, the Sanitary Authority considers that a salary of £15 a year will be ample remuneration for his services, and it trusts that the Local Government Board will approve of the same.

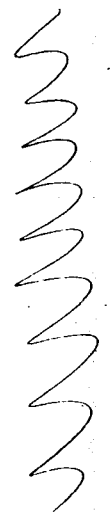

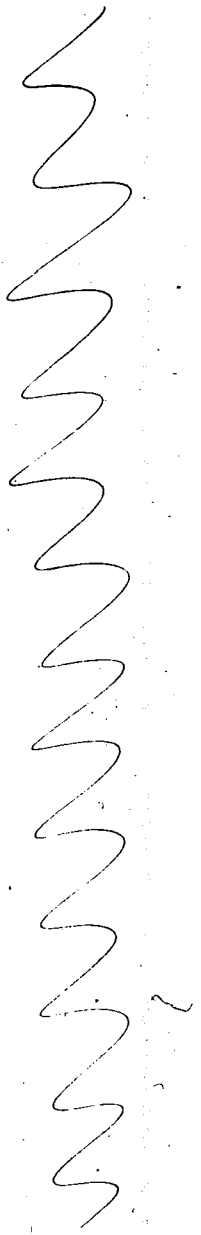

I beg to report for your information that I attended the Petty Sessions of the Town on Monday last, and was present at the hearing of a summons against Mr. J. P. Kelly, Schoolmaster of your Workhouse, for assaulting a woman named John Goerick in the streets of Ballinacree on the night of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Inst. Mr. Kelly was fined five shillings and costs.

From the evidence given at the Trial, it was proved that Mr. Kelly was perfectly sober at the time the assault was committed.
