

Protect Our Heritage: Beware of Treasure Hunters

It has come to our attention that an individual has been knocking on doors in the Shrule and Kilmaine areas, asking for access to fields containing ring forts. We want to remind landowners that it is illegal to excavate or disturb historical sites, including ring forts, without a licence from the Minister for Heritage and that even with a licence, landowners are not required to grant access to their property.



This issue is of great concern because there is a very real risk that artefacts uncovered may be taken out of Ireland, depriving archaeologists and museums of the opportunity to study, preserve, and share this valuable part of our history. When these items leave the country, we lose not only pieces of our past but the ability for future generations to learn from them.


Please be vigilant in protecting our cultural heritage. If you encounter anyone requesting access to your land for excavation, or suspect illegal activity, report it to the Gardaí immediately. Our heritage belongs here in Ireland, where it can be properly studied, preserved, and appreciated by all.

By working together, we can protect our shared history and ensure that future generations have the opportunity to connect with our rich cultural past.



Autumn Dues envelopes are now available at the back of the church for those who do not use the envelope system. If you are using the envelopes available at church, and are planning to apply for charity tax rebate, please write your name and envelope number on envelope **Please Note:** currently, there is only sufficient funds in this account to cover Fr. Loughrey's salary for November. Additionally, there was not sufficient funding in the account to cover the diocesan level - which remains outstanding.

What are Dues Envelopes?

The Autumn Dues envelopes along with Christmas and Easter Dues pay the salary of the priest of the parish and cover the diocesan levy which is used for the support of retired clergy. The current salary for the priest of the diocese is €1450 per calendar month.

What is the Weekly Offertory Collection for then?

It is a common misunderstanding that the weekly offertory collection is for the priest. In actually fact, the weekly offertory collections is for the regular upkeep and running of the parish. It does not form any part of the priest's income or salary.

It is a long tradition in families that children become altar servers, just as their parents before them. Altar servers have a long history in the church and in celebration of various liturgies, especially on weekends, funerals & weddings. Apart from enhancing the way liturgy is celebrated, becoming an altar server allows a child to grow in confidence and self-esteem by working and carrying out various activities in public, along with learning collaboration, teamwork, cooperation, and communication skills that are the basic building blocks of community.

The aim, depending on numbers, will be to form teams that will be put into a rota. It would be hoped that each team would have 5 pupils from various classes, allowing the students to learn from each other. While this will be the guide in forming teams, every effort will be made to accommodate pupils and parents/guardians.

Finally, in line with diocesan child safeguarding policy, you will need to complete Application Form SG-04, This along with an information leaflet 'Information & Guidance for Children/Parents' will be provided.




