Your Committee appointed to consider the Cost and expenditure for the Establishment and other Charges of the Union during the past year. having met on several occasions and enquired into the same, have now to report the result of their enquiry. -

The Committee is sorry to have to Advise

that

that there has not been on the part of the officers of the Establishment that attention and devotion to the interests of their employees, which it considers it had a right to expect from persons so well paid and provided for, and it has observed that a system has been introduced and of late very much prevailed with the Masters and his assistants to take upon themselves altogether unauthorised by the Board, to give orders to Contractors and provide goods and Articles. Some of them quite unnecessary and to an extent quite unwarrantable.

It is obvious that such a system cannot be allowed and it should be laid down as an invariable rule, that the Disbursements shall on no account ever sanction the payment of any expenditure or any Article unless ordered by the Board and signified under the signature of the Chairman of the day, and which orders should always be attached to the Bills, when laid before the Committee.

Any departure from this rule should be visited by the immediate dismissal of the officers concerned and the loss to the Contractor of the goods so irregularly supplied.

Again, it appears to your Committee, that it has been a practice with the Clerks to lay before the Chairman, requisitions for his signature, of the necessity for which he had not, as it was his duty to have done, been sufficiently informed himself, and frequently at times when it was impossible for the Board duly to consider them. To remedy a practice so improper, it is recommended that requisitions excepting for Food & necessaries, shall as far as possible, be made monthly & be subject to the consideration of the Finance Committee, before they are submitted to the Board.

The extravagance for which the Committee has most reason to complain has been in the Advertising, Printing & Stationary, there appears to have amounted within the last year to no less a sum than £181.16.10; for all local Advertisements a contract is now made at £10 a year, a sum ample and more than sufficient if only such Advertisements are published as are required, and if such Advertisements are of no unnecessary publicity and length.

The item for Printing, is capable of being reduced to less than one fourth of the present cost, the Committee recommend, that all Rate Books &c. should for the future be made up with an ordinary rough covering, and composed of paper printed and ruled, to be purchased by the Board.

In the Article of Stationary, again three fourths could be easily economized, as the waste has been fearful & unpardonable, all printed Covers, large folio oak paper, Sealing wax &c. in all our Establishment for the Support of Paupers and should be greatly reduced, if not altogether discontinued.

Postage, which should be a very trifling charge, is by carelessness made one of magnitude, during the last 12 Months it has amounted to £9.2.5, the Committee consider that one third would and ought to be sufficient, all Communications with Dublin are charged double postage from the foolish custom of writing on the most trivial subjects, on large heavy paper in large heaviest envelopes, the Committee consider that the Board should not be called upon

For Ironmongery, the most excessive extravagance is exhibited, and it is confidently to be expected, that the previous sanction and authority, after enquiry, of the Finance Committee, now required, will enormously reduce this branch of expenditure, and will put an end to the abuse that has existed of ordering articles unnecessary and unsuitable, and of so constantly replacing articles, such as Iron &c, which more care would render unnecessary.

For Medicines there has been a charge of £54.19.2. The Committee considered it very large, and they recommend that for the future all requisitions for the ordinary supplies should be made quarterly, and be considered by the Finance Committee like other requisitions.

Although the legal expenses are considerably reduced, they still far exceed what is to be hoped will be necessary under the more favourable circumstances of the Union, when its financial condition becomes as it ought to do, such as that all its expenditure can be promptly and fairly discharged, there can be no necessity for any law proceedings except in the enforcement of the payment of the Rates, which cannot be fairly charged against the Union at large, but must be laid on the Electoral Divisions in whose interests they are incurred.

The Committee has not applied itself to the very heavy charge incurred for Rent and repairs of Auxiliary Workhouses, as they confidently hope that such wasteful and ruinous establishments will not be required for the future.

The Salaries of this Establishment, the Committee consider still admit (if not immediately, at an early period) of reduction; they are of opinion that, as the duties have now greatly diminished, it is not unreasonable, but only just to the Rate payers, that this should be effected, so far as it can be done without injustice.

The Clerks Salary, now £110, should be reduced to £100 per annum, including payment as Retiring Officers, and for the expenses relating to the Registry of Voters.

The Surgeon's Salary of £100 a year might well be reduced to £80.

The Roman Catholic Chaplain's Salary should be reduced from £60 to £50 a year.

In the case of the Protestant Chaplain, the Committee considers that the Commissioners should allow a discontinuance of the Protestant services, by consenting to all Protestant paupers attending their own Church, and a Salary ^{only} of £10 a year, for such religious attendance as the Protestant inmates might require.

The Retiring Officers, now costing £110 a year, may, it is to be hoped, be soon reduced to £100, and perhaps less.

In respect to fuel, the Committee consider that economy might be introduced without in any way improperly lessening the comforts of the Paupers; they think that the same system as is now practiced in the weekly requisitions for food should be extended to fuel, the Board viewing the exact quantity that had been consumed the week previously, always allowing a sufficient reserve; and this requisition should be usually accompanied by a return of the number of fires, stating how many for the hall, house, laundry, kitchen, infirmary, officers, and Paupers, and again stating how many of these fires are necessary for the whole or half day.

The Committee have not been able to enter into any inquiry in respect to the Clothing and Manufactures of the houses, but they are quite assured that, to make this last profitable, it would be necessary that it should receive the very close supervision of gentlemen on the Board capable of such supervision, and who would voluntarily apply themselves to such an undertaking; if these gentlemen

"The Humble Petition of the Guardians of the Poor of the County of Mayo"

"Sheweth—That in consequence of the depressed state of the agricultural interest, and of its being already overtaxed, it is impolitic and unjust to burthen it with the additional taxation imposed on land by the Labour Rate or the Annuities Act.

"That where a famine of unexpected duration had afflicted one part of the empire, it was but just, and according to established custom, even among unchristian nations, that such calamity should have been met out of the Imperial Treasury.

"That not only has Ireland contributed, and yet continues to contribute, largely out of its Customs and Excise Duties, its Quit and Crown Rents, and other Taxes, to the Imperial Treasury, but by reason of the prohibition of growing tobacco in Ireland, the amount paid into the Treasury of the taxes on Colonial produce is thereby vastly increased, and that Ireland, therefore, has largely contributed directly and indirectly to the repayment of the money given by parliament to allay the Irish famine.

"That it had been promised, that useful public works of a reproductive and remunerative character would be carried on and completed by the Board of Works in Ireland, and that only one-half the sum actually expended in the completion of such public works would have been debited to Ireland; but that it is admitted, even by the government, that a large proportion of the moneys so advanced had been squandered and lost, and not at all applied to the execution of any works, or to the relief of the poor, but your petitioners show that a moiety of such portion of the moneys so recklessly squandered, lost, and misapplied, has been, contrary to good faith, charged against the country.

"That at the several road sessions, held under the Labour Rate Act, the officers of the Board of Works in attendance gave in estimates of the expenses of each work; and that such road sessions were induced to sanction such presentment, partly on the promises made that the works would be completed for the sum so estimated and limited; but your memorialists show that most of such works have been left unfinished, and now remain a nuisance and posi-

tive injury to the country, although in many cases further and additional grants were sanctioned at subsequent sessions, to complete such yet unfinished works.

"That the benefit to the country from such alleged expenditure has been very trifling, while the loss has been very great, by the yet continuing obstruction and disfigurement of the public roads, by the demoralisation of the peasantry, and above all, by the withdrawal, from their legitimate field of operations in the spring months, of the labouring population, by which an immense loss, amounting to millions sterling, has been incurred—a year's crop, together with its reproducing power, having been lost to the country.

"That no account of the sums actually expended on such works has ever been furnished, and that except such accounts are forthcoming, it is plain that no correct apportionment, charge, or certificate of the moneys claimed under the sealed orders of the Treasury or the Poor Law Commissioners, could have been properly made out, and that such sealed orders must have been arbitrarily and illegally issued.

"That in the absence of any accounts of expenditure, and should repayment of a moiety of the cost of the construction of such public works be insisted upon, your petitioners hope that such public works shall be inspected, measured and valued, and your petitioners will not thereupon object to pay a moiety of what such works shall be now found to be worth to the country.

"That your petitioners are convinced that since the Union of Great Britain and Ireland there has been a large annual surplus of receipts of Irish taxes over the necessary expenditure for its own establishments, and that if an account would be taken thereof, a larger balance would appear due to Ireland than the amount claimed against her on foot of the famine advances. Your petitioners, for reasons aforesaid, trust that your honourable house will apply such remedy in the premises as to your honourable house shall appear expedient and just.

"The Humble Petition of the Guardians of the Poor of the County of Mayo" in the County of Mayo. —

"Sheweth—That the taxation imposed on land in Ireland is now excessive and intolerable, and that the increase of such taxation has become so great a grievance that your petitioners are constrained to appeal for redress therefrom to your honourable house.

"That the compulsory grand jury presentments for the expenses of crown witnesses, for the gaols and bridewells, for the clerks of the crown and peace, and for the coroners, being all incidental to the general administration of justice, ought to be borne out of the Imperial Treasury.

"That the grand jury cess for the construction and maintenance of roads and bridges, the quit and crown rents, the tithe-rent charges, and the poor rates, form in addition a heavy burthen on the lands of Ireland, especially now that free trade has not only reduced the value of land and of all kinds of agricultural produce, but has also allowed untaxed foreigners and distant colonists to compete successfully with Irish farmers in the English markets; and your petitioners therefore entreat your honourable house to cause a re-adjustment of the present unfair system of taxation on land, so as to have some of the burthens that had been imposed upon it while it had the advantage of protection paid out of the Consolidated Fund, and out of the proceeds of the general taxation of the empire.

"Your petitioners, as further relief to the agricultural class, hope that your honourable house will cause the repeal of the duties on beet-root sugar, on malt, beer, and on

whiskey, and will remove the prohibition against growing tobacco in Ireland.

"And your petitioners will ever pray."



RE-PAYMENT OF ANNUITIES.

12 January 1852.

On yesterday, at 2 o'clock, a meeting of the guardians representing the several unions of the county was held in the court-house. On the motion of Colonel Gore, seconded by Sir Robert Lynch Blosse, the chair was taken by the Earl of Lucan. The other guardians present were—G. H. Moore, Esq., M.P., Colonel Knox, Colonel Gore, A. C. Lynch, Sir R. L. Blosse, Joseph Lambert, Austin F. Creane, Charles Strickland, Francis O'Grady, J. C. Larmaine, J. F. Lynch, Matthew Atkinson, Mervyn Pratt, Earnest Knox, G. J. O'Malley, James Malley, Hon. F. Cavendish, and J. Bole.

Lord Lucan, on taking the chair, said that the gentlemen present were aware that at their last meeting, on the 23d September, the guardians then present had confided to him the duty of calling them together when the period arrived when it would be necessary to do so. The present meeting was in consequence of that understanding. The meeting was aware of what happened after that meeting. He felt that the letter of Lord John Russell was an attempt to make the matter a personal one between Lord John Russell and himself, therefore he took the responsibility on himself and replied thereto, and he hoped that his reply had met their approbation (hear, hear). Subsequently, at the fair of Ballinasloe, a meeting was held for the same purpose, when resolutions were passed which were much to the same effect as ours. They did not plead for exemption as paupers, they objected to the demand, and refused to be made pay for monies over the expenditure of which they had no controul and against which they objected from the commencement, and further they deprecated the principle of government making the boards of guardians the collectors of this unjust tax or of any government tax. He (Lord Lucan) found the resolutions of this meeting so very similar to those of the Mayo meeting, that he and Colonel Gore supported them. One thing, however, is certain, that to Mayo is owing much of what has been conceded, and none will or can deprive us of the credit of having induced the government to act with reason and justice. The noble lord then proceeded to point out that Lord John Russell should have at once suspended the operation of the act which he was authorised to do, instead of continuing to impound the funds of distressed unions in the hands of their respective treasurers. But instead of acting thus, he had recourse to a system of tactics, by letter-writing, in which he has so far succeeded as to have quieted the agitation. At the former meeting, it will be recollected that our objections were at being called upon to repay monies over which we never had any controul. We called in vain for an account of how such money was expended, how or where, and further we objected to being forced to be made the collectors of a government tax. It is evident if we are not firm we shall expose ourselves to the charge of inconsistency. That he (Lord L.) having been called upon to advise by different boards, and always counselled that they should receive the Treasury letter without expressing any approval or disapproval of its contents, but await till the meeting of Parliament, and then to petition for inquiry. His lordship here commented on the absence of the representatives of unions whose unfortunate condition was such that they never expected to reduce their outlay below four shillings in the pound for forty years, and proceeded to show that they must be exceedingly short-sighted to consider it no question to them, and receive as a boon so fearful a tax.—He (Lord Lucan) remembered Lord Grey declaring at the passing of the poor law bill, that he would think desperately of a country that had to pay poor rates amounting to 2s 6d in the pound; but these gentlemen were not only grateful for having to pay 2s 6d in the pound, but they were quieted by being asked to pay four shillings in the pound! (hear, hear, hear.) On principle he (Lord Lucan) would most strenuously object to such an arrangement, as he could not imagine anything so mischievous as establishing so outrageous a principle, for if it were once known and felt that the greatest efforts of rate-payers, boards of guardians, and landowners were fruitless, and that a certain amount of expenditure should take place to avoid an unjust impost, who would ever take any trouble about the poor laws. He would rather reject the whole measure proposed by Lord John Russell than introduce so mischievous a principle. As to the minute itself, it was in fact telling the world that the government will not ask that which they could not get—that all who can must pay and all who cannot will not. His lordship concluded an able speech, of which we can only give an outline from pressure of time, by moving that a committee be selected to prepare a petition to both houses of parliament.

Colonel Gore fully concurred in the sentiments expressed by Lord Lucan, and regretted that in some of the distressed unions who were at present exempt, the guardians were holding back. He (Col. Gore) was further aware of the statement that the several unions were adverse to the expenditure of these monies, and read an extract from a resolution passed in Tyrawly in August 1847, declaring that the outlay of money as proposed, and in progress by government, was destructive to property, and would ruin the ratepayers.

Sir Robert L. Blosse remarked that in many cases the government plan would entail ruin, as it would give countenance to extravagance, and sacrifice electoral divisions where exertion and care were taken to keep down rates, for instance, in Clogher division through the outlay of money by Mr. Lynch, and subscriptions, employment, and emigration, the rates had been reduced from 4s. to 6d. and which would now be ruined by the government plan.

Mr. G. H. Moore, as the representative of the county, said he would feel much pleasure in forwarding the views of the meeting, more particularly as he felt that Lord John Russell by his proposition placed a penalty on care and forethought a principle which the government for years past endeavoured to force on us. He would exert himself in his position to effect the end proposed—full and fair inquiry—which he trusted the petitioners would have extended to them.

Counsellor Atkinson—Although the union from whence I came, pay a rate of 6s. 3d. in the pound so fully, did the guardian's concur in the necessity of having this meeting well attended, and a strict inquiry instituted that they deputed me to attend here.

Lord Lucan here proposed that a committee be selected to prepare a petition; the following gentlemen were named:— Lord Lucan, Col. Gore, Sir R. L. Blosse, Mr. Moore, M.P.; Mr. A. C. Lynch, Mr. Strickland, Mr. Knox, Mr. Atkinson, Mr. J. F. Lynch, Mr. Lambert, and Mr. V. O'C Blake.

In about an hour the Committee returned and laid before the meeting the following petition. [We omit the figures as they have not been ascertained from the several unions as yet.]

The humble Petition of the Guardians of the several Unions of Castlubar, Westport, Ballina, Ballinrobe, Claremorris, Swinford, Bohmullet, Killala, and Newport, in the County of Mayo,

HUMBLY SHewETH—That the commissioners for administering the laws for the relief of the poor in Ireland have, by warrant from her Majesty's Treasury, and in pursuance of the provisions of the act of 9 and 10 Victoria, charged upon the several townlands of the said unions, annuities for the next forty years, varying in amount in each, but amounting in the whole to £603,202-7, and not content with issuing their orders to the several boards to strike rates in discharge of the same, did at once, and immediately, empound a certain proportion of the rates as they were collected; and at a time, when another portion of the said rates had been already arrested for the payment of the rate in aid, by which course of proceeding, on the part of the Commissioners, the financial condition of the different unions already sufficiently distressed has been one of such difficulty as very seriously to embarrass them in the administering of the necessary relief.

That of the said annuities £27,992 were so charged for the repayment of the advances made for building work-houses, £212,650 for labour rate and temporary relief, and £372,750 for interest upon the above amounts at three and one-half per cent. on the whole.

That with respect to the said charges of £— and £— for monies alleged to have been refunded under the labour rate and temporary relief acts, your petitioners respectfully submit that they ought not and cannot with justice be called upon to repay monies which were neither advanced in accordance with their views nor placed at the disposal or under the controul of their boards or any local authority, but were on the contrary applied and expended in opposition to their oft-repeated, but as oft unheeded objections, and public remonstrances, and by officers altogether independent of them, and responsible to the government alone.

That these monies were, through mismanagement and incompetency on the part of those officers, wasted and squandered in the most reckless manner, and expended on works which are, and ever must be, utterly useless; they moreover inflicted immense damages on the county, a small portion of the claims for compensation of the same having amounted to no less than £36,000.

That, though one half of the monies thus lavished is included in the said annuities, still that the amount of relief afforded was altogether disproportionate to the large and frightful amount now brought to charge against the unions, and that the persons so relieved, were not entitled to it, by any poor law then existing.

That such relief was necessary in consequence of a famine unparalleled in its extent or its duration, and which has been admitted by your honourable house to have been a national calamity.

Your petitioners, believe it to be not only unusual, but without precedent, that an expenditure by the public treasury, in the relief of a national calamity should be charged on those parts of the empire alone which were most seriously if not solely afflicted.

That if this impoverished, exhausted, and depopulated

country can, without any appearance of right, be held liable for monies expended under such management for such an object and under such circumstances, your petitioners submit that the repayment cannot with justice be laid on the owners and occupiers of land alone, who were the only sufferers, but should be extended to all classes equally.

That we hold it to be foreign to our duties as guardians of the poor to levy monies for other purposes than for the relief of the destitute, and that we consider that our being made agents for the collection of any other taxes whatever, both dangerous in principle and mischievous in the carrying out of that law, which it is our first duty to administer.

That in the passing of this act your petitioners cannot believe that your honourable house did give it that consideration which it deserved, but that you allowed it to pass, uninformed of the frightful amount to be charged upon certain parts of this country, that amount being heavier generally in proportion to the extent of distress, and they are satisfied that you will not refuse to reconsider an enactment so onerous and so oppressive.

May it therefore please your honourable house to institute an immediate enquiry before one of your committees, which shall closely investigate what portion of the said advances, can and ought to be charged against this already heavily taxed country, perhaps more heavily taxed than any part of the empire, or any other country in Europe, and shall further enquire upon whom such repayment, if any, can be most equitably imposed, and by what means and through what agency the same should be collected and recovered.

And your petitioners will for ever pray,
Proposed by Sir R. L. Blosse and seconded by Colonel Gore,

That a petition be presented by the Earl of Lucan and G. H. Moore, Esq., M.P. and that they be requested to move in their respective houses for committees of enquiry; or act in any other way most conducive to success.
